

**ENGLISH AND WRITING** - 0-6 hours, as determined by the English Placement/Proficiency Examination. One approved 3-hour writing course relevant to the student's major.

**ORAL COMMUNICATION** - 3 hours

**MATHEMATICS** 3 hours excluding Math 1430, 1530, 1600, and 2000. Placement determined by Mathematics Placement Exam (see information in catalog). Mathematics course is not required if proficiency is established by an ACT Math Score of 23 or higher unless required by major.

Above courses must be completed by the end of the semester in which you earn 60 hours, except for the additional writing course, and you must have a C- or better in each course.
