

CULTURAL DIVERSITY - 6 hours - Six hours of course work designed to enhance cultural diversity are required. An approved three hour course in United States racial or Hispanic minority groups must be completed by all students. The second three hours of the cultural diversity requirement must be met by a three hour course approved to have an international focus, an approved course in women's studies, an approved course addressing gay, lesbian, or transgender issues, an approved course addressing issues related to human aging or by another course dealing with U.S. minorities. The required World Civilization courses may not be used to meet this requirement.
