Rule 20 of the Nebraska State Board of Education requires the institution to inform all persons who apply for admission to its program that persons who have felony convictions, or misdemeanor convictions involving abuse, neglect, or sexual misconduct, as defined in Section 005.7A, are automatically rejected by the Department for certification, or participation in pre-student teaching field, laboratory, and classroom experiences or student teaching.

The institution shall require all prospective teacher education students to provide a list of all criminal convictions, except traffic offenses. The institution shall require prospective students to affirm under oath that he or she has no felony and no misdemeanor convictions involving abuse, neglect, or sexual misconduct.

Rule 21 of the Nebraska State Board requires that teacher education students provide evidence of emotional or mental capacity. The student is required to affirm under oath that he or she does not have an order or determination currently in effect by a court or any other governmental body which finds the student to be any of the following: a mentally ill and dangerous person, mentally incompetent to stand trial, acquitted of criminal charges because of insanity, an incapacitated person in need of a guardian, or unable to manage his/her property due to mental illness, mental deficiency, chronic use of drugs or chronic intoxication, or is currently an inpatient or resident in a mental facility due to a determination by a qualified mental health professional.
