GERONTOLOGY:

The study of the physical, psychological, and social aspects of aging. A way of life.

Certificate (18 Credits)

- <u>Gerontology Coursework</u>: Students choose 15 credit hours (5 courses) in gerontology based on their career and educational goals.
- <u>Gerontology Practicum</u>: 3 credit hours Students complete 156 hours at a practicum site of their choice. This allows for important real-world experience before graduation.
- Sample Courses:

GERO 200: Intro to Gerontology

GERO 446: Psychology of Adult Development

GERO 450: Legal Aspects of Aging

GERO 451: Long-term Care Administration

GERO 455: Health Aspects of Aging

- Available for undergraduate and graduate students.
- May be completed by individuals who are working in the field and does not require full-time enrollment at UNL.

Minor (18 Credits)

The minor is very similar to the certificate. However, students who pursue the minor are not required to complete a practicum and choose a traditional course instead.










