Race alone is the difference between the number of persons selecting the race in 1990 and the number of persons selecting the one race alone in 2000. (Persons selecting more than one race in 2000 are excluded.) This represents the minimum change.

Race alone or in combination is the difference between the number of persons selecting the race in 1990 and the number of persons selecting the race either alone or in combination in 2000. (Persons selecting more than one race in 2000 are included, and they are counted under each race they selected. For example, a person selecting both "White" and "Black or African American" is counted once under "White" and again under "Black or African American".) This represents the maximum change.

In addition to allowing respondents to select more than one race, the 2000 Census incorporated changes in the order and wording of questions on race and ethnicity. These changes also affect the comparability of 2000 census counts with those from 1990. The effect of these changes cannot be determined but is probably small for most areas.
