

THIRD ENGLISH REQUIREMENT

Criminology & Criminal Justice majors are required to complete a minimum of nine hours of Composition coursework for the UNO general education requirements.

Please Note: Specific courses that improve students' writing skills in accordance with the UNO learning objectives have been approved. Only these courses will count toward the 3rd English requirement. Other English courses completed but not on this list will be counted elsewhere in the student's program of study.

English Placement:

Students may test out of one or both of ENGL 1150: Composition I and ENGL 1160: Composition II. Students are not able to test out of the remaining third English requirement.

- If students test out of Composition I, 6 hours of Composition is required.
- If students test out of both Composition I and Composition II, 3 hours of Composition is required.

APPROVED COURSES

ENGL 2400: Advanced Composition

Prerequisite: ENGL 1160 or permission.

Course Description:

A study in the principles of rhetoric, expository modes, research techniques, consistency in grammatical structure, and variety of usage with attention to audience adaptation and writer's style.

ENGL 3980: Technical Writing Across the Disciplines

Prerequisite: ENGL 1160 or permission.

Course Description:

This course emphasizes the problem-solving processes of producing effective written documents and visuals in technical professions. Students will study the genres, situations, and audiences related to professional settings, the contexts in which writing occurs, the process involved in individual and collaborative projects, and the production of technical documents.

MGMT 3200 Managerial Communications

Prerequisite: ENGL 1160, SPCH 1110 or 2120, all graded "C" or better, 2.5 GPA or higher.

Course Description:

This course builds upon the skills learned in the prerequisites. Students will develop and demonstrate skills in selecting and using the appropriate technology for reaching the intended audience. The student's projects will demonstrate skills with advanced word processing, multimedia presentations, email transmissions, and web pages.
