

CRIMINOLOGY & CRIMINAL JUSTICE GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

(For students starting at UNO Prior to Fall 2011)

English: (9 credits)

- ENGL 1150/1154: Composition I
- ENGL 1160/1164: Composition II
- Third Writing Course
 - o Please see an advisor or refer to the 3rd Writing Course handout for approved courses

Social Science: (12 credits)

- No more than 6 credits from one department.
- Choose from the following areas:
 - o Anthropology
 - o Black Studies
 - o Economics
 - o Geography (but not Physical Geography courses)
 - o Gerontology
 - o History
 - o Native American Studies
 - o Political Science
 - o Psychology
 - o Public Administration
 - o Sociology
 - o Social Work
 - o Urban Studies
 - o Women's Studies

Humanities: (9 credits + 3 credits of SPCH 1110 or SPCH 2120 = 12 credits)

- No more than 8 credits from one department
- 3 credits must be from SPCH 1110: Public Speaking or SPCH 2120: Argumentation & Debate
- 9 credits from the following areas:
 - o Art
 - o Broadcasting
 - o English Literature
 - (ENGL 1150/1154 or ENGL 1160/1164 are not Literature courses)
 - o Foreign Languages
 - o Journalism
 - o Music
 - o Philosophy
 - o Speech Communication
 - (other than SPCH 1110 or SPCH 2120)
 - o Theatre

Natural Science & Mathematics: (9 credits + 3 credits of MATH 1320: College Algebra = 12 credits)

- 3 credits must include MATH 1320: College Algebra (or higher)
 - o If students complete the pre-requisite, MATH 1310: Intermediate Algebra, this class is an elective
- Students must complete 1 lab course
- Choose 9 credits of Natural Science from the following areas:
 - o Astronomy (PHYS 1350 + lab PHYS 1354)
 - o Biology
 - o Chemistry
 - o Food Science (FSCI 1310)
 - o Geology
 - o Horticulture
 - o Physical Geography
 - o Physics
 - o Computer Science (1500 or higher)

Statistics: (3 credits)

- Choose one course from the following:
 - o CRCJ 3000
 - o PA 3000
 - o SOWK 3000
 - o STAT 3000
 - o SOC 2130
 - o PSYC 3130

CULTURAL DIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

(For students starting at UNO Prior to Fall 2011)

Each student must complete 6 credit hours of cultural diversity courses

- One course must have a U.S. racial or Hispanic minority group focus (listed as specific).
 - CRCJ 3380 Minorities and Criminal Justice, meets 3 hours of this requirement.
- The remaining 3 hours can be satisfied with another 3 hour course in minority studies, women's studies, or course work with an international or foreign focus.
 - CRCJ 3390 Women, Crime and Justice, CRCJ 4760 Terrorism, and CRCJ 4710 Comparative Criminal Justice Systems: England, meets 3 hours of this requirement.
