APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED: OCTOBER 1-MARCH 1

The applicant must complete and submit the Goodrich application and submit ALL required materials to the Goodrich Scholarship Program by **MARCH 1** to be considered. Applicants who will have earned more than thirty-one college credits by May of the year they would enter the Goodrich Scholarship Program are NOT eligible for the Goodrich scholarship. Applicants who receive a Nebraska state Regents or NU-Paths scholarship are NOT eligible for the Goodrich scholarship. **ONLY United States Citizens or legal non-citizens of the United States who are residents of Nebraska are eligible for this scholarship.**

Application Process (All Required Materials):

- 1. Goodrich Scholarship Application Form.** The applicant must complete and submit the Goodrich Scholarship Application Form by **MARCH 1**, the application deadline. You may complete the form online at <http://goodrich.unomaha.edu/> or you may request a hard copy from the Goodrich Scholarship Program at (402) 554.2274. Applications are made available beginning **OCTOBER 1**.
- 2. University of Nebraska at Omaha Application.** Applicants must follow the online instructions at http://admissions.unomaha.edu/app_info.php or call UNO's admissions department at (402) 554.2393 for assistance. Applicants must officially apply to UNO by **MARCH 1**, the application deadline. Applicants must be officially admitted to UNO.
- 3. Official Reference Forms.** The applicant must submit TWO official reference forms completed by teachers, counselors, employers or other professionals who are not family members or friends. The applicant is responsible for seeing that the Goodrich Scholarship Program receives the two references by **MARCH 1**, the application deadline. Reference forms are also available online or are available as hard copies through the Goodrich Scholarship Program beginning **OCTOBER 1**.
- 4. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).** The applicant must establish financial need as determined by the UNO Financial Aid Office. Financial need is determined by completing and submitting the FAFSA beginning January 1. To complete the FAFSA go to <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/#> and follow the online instructions or call UNO's Financial Aid Office at (402) 554.2327. To enable Goodrich to preliminarily assess the applicant's financial need, the applicant can complete the College Funding Estimator online at <http://www.educationquest.org/college-funding-estimator/> to accommodate the **MARCH 1** application deadline. All pages of this estimate must be printed out and submitted to the Goodrich Scholarship Program by the **MARCH 1** application deadline. The FAFSA must still be completed by the applicant before Goodrich can award any scholarship.
- 5. English Placement and Proficiency Exam (EPPE).** The UNO Testing Center schedules this test which must be taken by **MARCH 1**, the application deadline. There are 7 testing dates available prior to the application deadline. Testing dates (subject to change) are October 15, November 12, December 3 of 2011 and January 7, January 21, February 4 and February 18 of 2012. To register for the EPPE and to confirm EPPE date, go to <http://www.unomaha.edu/english/placement.php> or call UNO's Testing Center (402)554.4800.
- 6. Official Transcripts AND ACT/SAT scores.** The applicant must submit an official high school transcript (or GED), ACT/SAT scores, and any college transcripts to the Goodrich Scholarship Program by the **MARCH 1** application deadline. Separate ACT/SAT scores are not necessary if those scores are currently attached to the applicant's high-school transcript. **This is in addition to the official transcript that must be sent to UNO's Admissions Office.** Note: Transcripts faxed directly from high school offices will be accepted.

Only after applicants have completed and submitted the six steps above by **MARCH 1, 2012**, will the Goodrich Scholarship Program consider the applicant's file complete and the applicant eligible. Eligible applicants with complete files will then be invited to an interview and asked to write a personal essay. Applicants can track their application status online.
