## **Proof of English Proficiency (PEP) and Waivers**

Upon receipt of proper documentation, students educated in the United States or any of the approved countries below may receive a Proof of English Proficiency requirement waiver. In order to qualify, students must do one of the following:

- Provide proof of graduation from an accredited U.S. college or university with a bachelor's degree or higher, or:
- Provide proof that their education has been completed in an approved English-speaking country.

Visiting exchange students should talk to their home institution's international office for specific requirements. Also read the instructions for Incoming Exchange Students.

\*Citizens of countries marked with an asterisk (\*) may be considered for a PEP waiver by presenting the following:

**New Zealand** 

- **High school records**: For those countries that require students to pass a national examination, such as Nigeria, high school graduates must submit official national examination results. For example: West African Exam Council (WAEC), Nigerian Exam Council (NEC), or Kenya Exam Council (KEC). The results should have a mark of "Credit" or "Pass" in the English section.
- University-level English: Proof of completing at least one university-level English course at an accredited college or university.

Another option for PEP waiver consideration:

Associate's degree: Completion of an Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree from a regionally accredited U.S. post-secondary institution with a 2.5 or higher grade point average. Official U.S. collegiate transcripts must be sent directly to UNO, and include specified collegiate coursework completed with a grade of C or better. Additional requirements may apply.
