Non-certified Library Science concentration

- 4710** Reference and Bibliography (3) A basic course which examines the principles, policies and new developments in library reference services. The course focuses on the processes of information literacy and engages candidates in the examination and evaluation of print and electronic reference sources.
- 4740** Cataloging and Classification (3) A basic course in cataloging and classification. Course content and laboratory work is designed to engage candidates in descriptive and subject cataloging procedures proscribed by the American Library Association and the Library of Congress.
- 4760** Selection & Evaluation of Educational Media (3) A course in the selection of materials for libraries and information agencies. Candidates will be engaged in an examination of policies concerning information access, information literacy, intellectual freedom and collection management.
- 4650** Children's Literature and Education (3) Explores story, poetry, drama, and informational materials for elementary and middle school levels with an emphasis on methods for including literature in school curricula and children's lives. Examines current issues, recent materials, and the theoretical and research base of this field to develop meaningful and creative learning, literacy, and library experiences for children.
- 4660** Young Adult Literature and Education (3) Explores story, poetry, drama, and informational materials for middle and secondary school levels, with an emphasis on methods for including literature in school curricula and young adults' lives. Examines current issues, recent materials, and the theoretical and research base of this field to develop meaningful and creative learning, literacy, and library experiences.
- 4800** Administration of the Library Media Program (3) A course designed for candidates who wish to prepare themselves for the administration of an educational media program within an elementary and/or secondary school.
- 4570** Practicum in Library/Media (3) This three credit hour supervised practicum is designed to give librarians and library media specialists an overview of the administrative and instructional aspects of a library/media center. *Prereq: Minimum 24 hours of library media and permission of dept advisor.*
- 4720** Special Libraries (3) An advanced course which emphasizes information services and resources in specialized disciplines, content areas, special library and government documents. (Cross-listed with TED-4720.)
- 3100** Organizations, Applications and Technology (3) An introduction to organizations and the role that information and information systems play in supporting an organization's operations, decision making processes, quality management and strategic activities. Also includes management of the IS function, strategic and regulatory issues of telecommunications, ethical and legal issues.
- 3110** Information Technology Ethics (3) The course will cover the development and need for issues regarding privacy, the effect of current legislation, and the application of computer ethics to information technology. *Prereq: CIST 3100*
