A maximum of 64 semester hours (96 qtr. hrs.) will be accepted by UNO for transfer into the BS in Social Work program.

The application deadline for the Bachelor of Science in Social Work program is January 15th each year. Students should apply when they have completed or are close to completing 60 semester hours (90 quarter hours) of courses. The following provisions apply:

- 1. The student will be permitted to transfer the designated credits earned given the following conditions and exceptions:
 - Student must have a cumulative 2.5 grade point average (GPA) and a 2.5 GPA in MCC Human Services
 courses.
 - b. No grades lower than "C" will be accepted into the University or into the Social Work program.
 - c. Quarter credit hours convert to semester hours at a ratio of 4.5 qtr. hrs. to 3 sem. hours.
- Admission into the B.S.S.W. program is competitive, based on academic record, letters of recommendation, personal
 statement, and human services work or volunteer experience. Completion of required prerequisite coursework does not
 guarantee admission. Admission packets can be requested from a UNO academic advisor or the admissions secretary of
 the School of Social Work.
- The student will be required to complete all additional Social Work and general education courses as prescribed by the University and the School of Social Work.
- 4. The student will be awarded the Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Nebraska at Omaha upon successful completion of all degree requirements.
