We offer a dual degree in Social Work and Public Administration.

Job Description: teach primarily graduate advanced level macro practice courses such as social welfare planning, supervision/administration, and others as negotiated; advise students; provide leadership for the advanced generalist concentration; maintain a productive research/publication agenda; contribute to the service/outreach needs of the School, University, and community. Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Required Qualifications: MSW plus a minimum of three years post-MSW practice experience and doctorate in Social Work or a related field; demonstrated record of or potential for scholarly research and publications. ABD may be considered. For best consideration, we are also interested in licensure, substantial practice experience including a combination of administrative, planning, and policy activities; experience in teaching advanced macro practice courses; interest in distance/online education; and knowledge of or demonstrated expertise with diverse multicultural and vulnerable or underserved groups.
