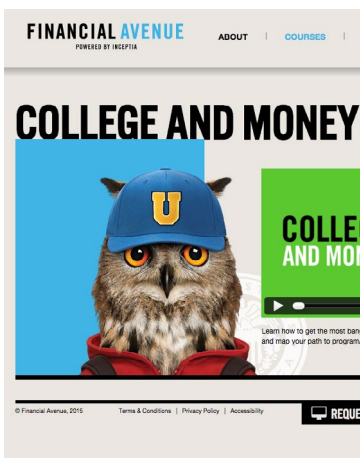

Get Started

1. Go to financialavenue.org
2. Click the "Login" link at the top of the page
3. Within the "Don't have an account?" section, select "Sign up now!"
4. Provide the access code **3tnhx2**, and click "Sign Up"
5. Create your account by populating the required fields





FAQ: BILLING

How is my bill processed?

Bills are processed the last business day of the month and with a due date of the 23rd of the following month. UNO generates PDF e-bills only for current term balances. These e-bills are posted to MavLink and students are notified through their UNO email when their bill is ready to be viewed.

Can I pay a bill with a credit card over the phone?

NO. Student accounts/cashiering cannot process credit card payments over the phone.

Is there an explanation of the academic fees somewhere?

FACT OR FICTION?

Get a jump start on applying for financial aid for the 2016-2017 academic year. Be prepared by knowing the facts:

Students who file the FAFSA early can get more financial aid.

FACT: Schools have limited financial aid to distribute and application deadlines are as early as February in some states. At UNO, our priority deadline for filing the FAFSA is April 1st. Keep in mind, aid is awarded on a **FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS**.

The first offer of financial aid that students receive is set in stone.

FICTION: If you or your family experienced significant changes to your financial situation (such as loss of employment, you can appeal your financial aid offer. This is known as Professional Judgment. The financial aid administrator will review your family's financial paperwork more closely and determine if an adjustment is warranted.

Some colleges let students attend tuition-free.

FACT: UNO is no exception. Collegebound Nebraska, the University's expanded financial aid program, provides free tuition for students who meet certain academic and family income qualifications. To learn more, visit collegeboundnebraska.com

SCHOLARSHIP TIPS

UNO disburses almost 2 million dollars in outside scholarship funding annually! This is a ton of money!

Scholarships play an important role in paying for college, so don't overlook various resources that can help pay for college expenses. Utilize these eight tips to help you get started.

1 MEET ALL APPLICATION DEADLINES

Get organized! Use a calendar and checklist to keep track of all application deadlines. Don't miss out on potential free money by submitting items late.

2 APPLY ONLY IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE

Be honest! Don't exaggerate your grades, skills, or qualifications. It is better to focus on the scholarships for which you might be eligible.

3 READ APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY

Complete everything! Read the entire application and provide everything that is required. You can give yourself an advantage by reading directions carefully and avoid sending something that hasn't been requested.

4 DON'T IGNORE SMALL AWARDS

Small awards can add up! Many times the larger awards have more competition, so don't overlook the smaller ones.

5 MAKE COPIES OF EVERYTHING YOU SUBMIT

Be prepared! Things happen and if materials get lost you will be able to reproduce it quickly.

6 INCREASE YOUR CHANCES OF SUCCESS

Strategize! Some applications require letters of recommendations. Select people who will provide specific details about your strengths and positive traits that may set you apart from other applicants.

7 GET CREATIVE

Research! Not every scholarship requires an essay or letter of recommendation. There are tons of scholarships that have a more creative feel to them from taking a photo to blogging to even whether you are left-handed!

8 BE NEAT AND PROFESSIONAL

Take your time! Your scholarship application represents you. Your ability to submit a proofread, neat, timely, and complete application will give you the best chance of being awarded a scholarship.

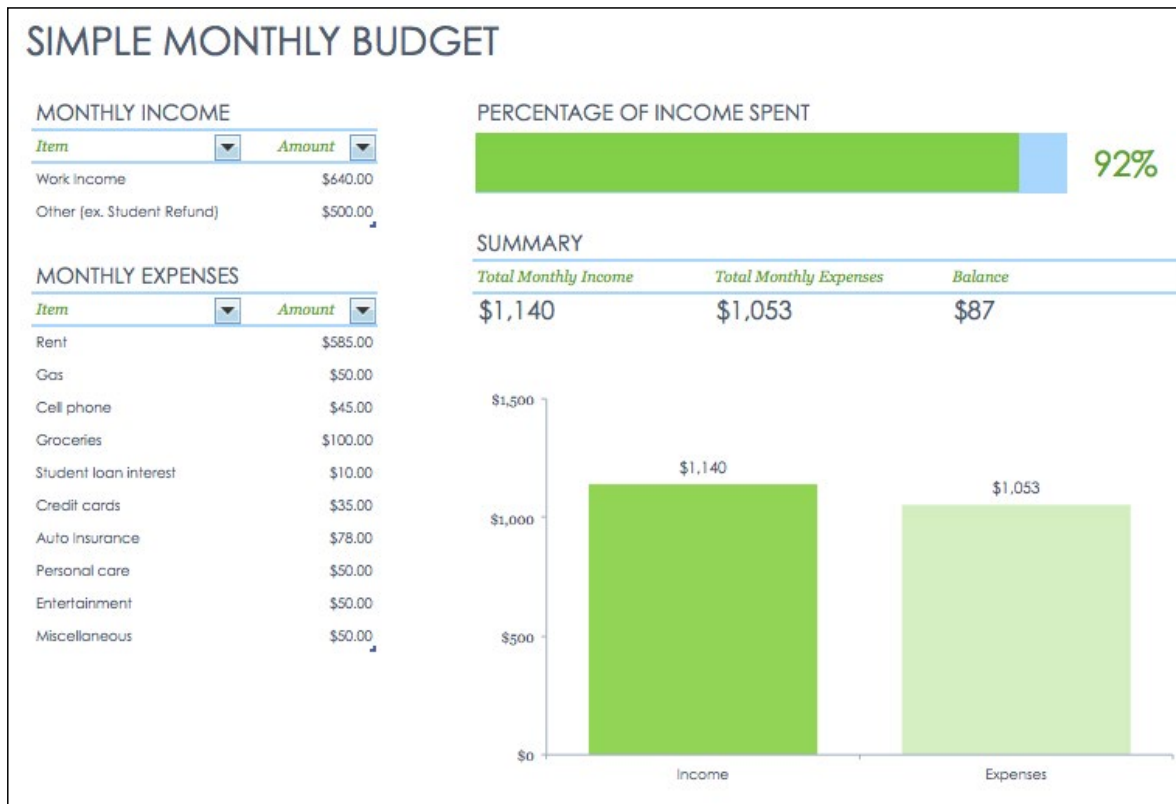
MONTHLY BUDGET

The best way to understand your finances is to create a monthly budget.

A monthly budget tracks where your money is coming from and where it is going. Begin by writing out a list of your sources of income and expenses. Some of your money may come from parents, employers, or even your financial aid refunds and will go to a wide variety of places including bills, food, and entertainment.
