With a Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Inclusive Education (BSED) from UNO, you will be eligible for Nebraska teacher licensure in birth to grade 3. The Early Childhood Inclusive specialization equips students with knowledge and skills surrounding the appropriate curriculum for young children (birth to age 8) in various settings. This program delves into child development, evidence-based practices, and strategies to meet the needs of all learners.
