It examines social structures, interactions, and inequalities to understand societal dynamics and inform policies aimed at fostering social justice and cohesion. Anthropology involves studying human societies and cultures across time and space, exploring aspects like social structures, beliefs, behaviors, and material cultures. It encompasses methods from archaeology, ethnography, and linguistic analysis to understand diversity and continuity in human experience.
