Public schools are the main battleground today in U.S. culture wars around church-state separation and religious liberty. Rabbi Segal will discuss debates over religious establishment and free exercise in relation to federal “school choice” tax credits, religious charter schools, and attempts to legislate displays of the Ten Commandments and school prayer. He will specifically examine the religious freedom implications of attempts to create private school voucher programs here in Nebraska.

Rabbi David Segal. As policy counsel for Baptist Joint Committee for Religious Liberty (BJC), Rabbi Segal oversees BJC’s national, state, and local advocacy agenda and supports litigation efforts on church/state separation and religious freedom. Segal has worked as a policy advocate, community organizer, congregational rabbi, and federal judicial clerk.
