Please join us for a screening of the documentary *Abraham's Bridge*, a film that follows the Tri-Faith Initiative from an initial idea in 2005 to the present day, with diverse religious communities working together to construct their dream, confront unanticipated challenges, and look toward an uncertain future. The film focuses especially on the importance of the Tri-Faith Unity Garden to enhance interreligious cooperation and engagement with the surrounding community on issues of food insecurity.

At this event, we will screen the documentary, then hear reflections from panelists involved with the Tri-Faith Unity Garden; the Maverick Food Pantry; and pedagogy of communication and dialogue at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. A light lunch will be provided.
