Additional UNMC Nursing Information

Students applying to UNMC must have the following:

- ✓ A college cumulative prerequisite grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- ✓ No grade lower than a C+ in any prerequisite course
- ✓ A maximum of 12 credit hours that are non-graded (AP, CLEP, or Pass/Fail)
- ✓ 12 out of the 17 required prerequisite courses completed by the time of application
- ✓ Two letters of recommendation
- ✓ Current CNA certification

UNMC Nursing has five locations: Omaha, Lincoln, Norfolk, Kearney, and Scottsbluff.

Nursing Timeline	
Freshman Year	Obtain CNA certification Take 7-10 Nursing pre-requisites.
Sophomore Year	Apply to UNMC Nursing ASAP when 12/17 prerequisites are completed. Applications open in October and are due in February. Continue completing prerequisites.
Junior Year	Work on BSN/RN at UNMC.
Senior Year	Complete BSN/RN at UNMC.
