

# Kerrigan Research Minigrant Proposal

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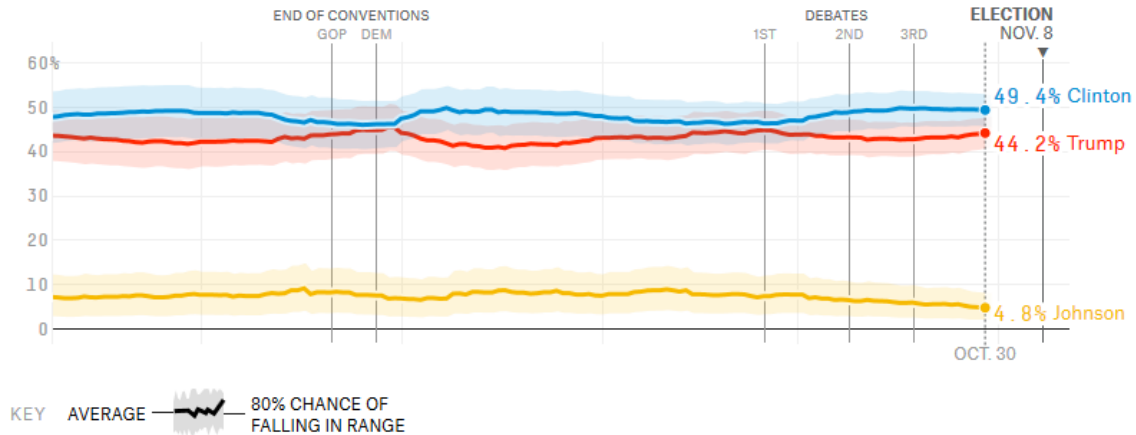

**Title of Project:** Interactively Exploring 2016 US Presidential Election Polling Data

**Description:** The US presidential election is the most important social and political event for the country in 2016. Media and poll organizations have been releasing their state and nationwide poll results and predictions every few days. The following figure shows the timely forecast from June to October by a polls-only model built by fivethirtyeight.com<sup>1</sup>.



This research is intended to learn about the 2016 election polls and predictions. We are interested in how the trend changes over time and whether the big events like debates impact on people's choices. An interactive visualization website will be built to display the data and explore the trend. Time series and spatial studies will also be provided.
