A candidate for the director's position at OLLAS, Dr. Caminero-Santangelo earned a Ph.D. in English from the University of California, Irvine. She is a professor in the English Department and Interim Director of the Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies at the University of Kansas. Her academic research in the field of 20th and 21st century U.S. Latina/o literary studies focuses on the conjunction between literature, group identity, and what we might call activism, or the ability to promote social change.

Dr. Caminero-Santangelo's research interests more broadly involve the question of how literature interacts with the "real world." She has published three books: "The Madwoman Can't Speak: Or Why Insanity Is Not Subversive" (Cornell UP, 1998); *On Latinidad: US Latino Literature and the Construction of Ethnicity* (UP Florida, 2007); and most recently, "Documenting the Undocumented: Latina/o Narrative and Social Justice in the Era of Operation Gatekeeper" (UP Florida, 2016).
