The U.S. Latino population is not only growing, it is becoming increasingly diverse. Spanish-speakers from different backgrounds are sharing social space, marrying each other, and raising children in homes where more than one kind of Spanish is spoken.

This presentation focuses on a study of MexiRicans — individuals with one Mexican and one Puerto Rican parent — and asks questions such as: How do MexiRicans experience and perform their mixed ethnicities? Does their Spanish tend to "look" more Mexican or more Puerto Rican? How does their Spanish variety mark them ethnolinguistically?
