A candidate for the director's position at OLLAS, Dr. Raymond Rocco is on the faculty of the Department of Political Science at the University of California at Los Angeles. His work focuses on studying how the evolving relationships between neoliberalism, democracy, citizenship, and human rights have affected Latino/a communities in the U.S. and traces the development of Latino grassroots organizing that challenge the regime of neoliberalism. His recent book, *Transforming Citizenship: Democracy, Membership, and Belonging in Latino Communities*, received the Latino Politics Award for Best Book in 2014 by the APSA Latino Caucus and he is currently working on a book, *Contesting Neoliberalism: Latino Grassroots Politics Reclaiming Democracy*.
