
# Hispanic Population Growth: Opportunities and Challenges

### **Selective Trends**

- 1. The state's population is getting older and will continue to age.
- 2. The state's population is becoming more diverse:
  - a) Hispanics accounted for 2/3 of the state's overall growth
  - b) Whites grew at less than one half of one percent
- 3. Most of the state's as well as Latino population growth is due to natural increase, not immigration.
- 4. 2010-2013: domestic in-migration was negative (-3,035) and International migration was positive (7,332)


