MA and MS program require 36 hours.

Ph.D. courses require the same courses as MA + additional ones listed as well as those determined by the program committee. Total of 90 hours minimum required for Ph.D., of those 45 must be taken during and after the semester in which the program of study is submitted.

Please also note that courses in management have a limited number of seats that are available to non-MBA students due to accreditation. In addition, a few courses may not be available at all (leadership skills is one of these).
