
# SECTION 504 ACCOMMODATION PLANS

## **ABOUT 504 PLANS**

- 504 plans are formal plans developed by schools to give individuals the accommodations they may need to succeed and learn!
- Accommodations could include visual aids, extended test times, a home-school note, and medication administration.
- The plans can be created for accommodations at schools, colleges, and workplaces
- The plans are part of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act.

### **WHAT ARE THEY?**






- A person who has a disability that limits a major life activity may qualify.
- Disabilities including anxiety, asthma, autism, depression, dyslexia, epilepsy, and type 1 diabetes may qualify a child for a 504 plan.
- Guidelines state that a plan should be created by people familiar with

the child and understand the data and options available.

 This could include teachers, school administrators, school psychologists, and parents.



# WHAT ARE THEY SUPPOSED TO DO?

- 504 plans are designed to help the student to succeed alongside their peers while receiving an education!
- This could include visual aids, extended test times, and behavior intervention plans.
- The accommodations allow them an equal opportunity to participate in academic and extracurricular activities.
