  - Format: Indicate whether this will be a paper (20 minutes), poster presentation (48" x 36"), or other
  - <u>Materials needed</u>: If the presentation requires additional items other than projector, screen, and computer cart, please explain and list these.
- Create a file (.doc, .docx, .rtf only) with all the information in the body of the email and attach it.
