

MINORS

A minor in French, German, Spanish, or Spanish for Health Sciences consists of a total of 15 credit hours at the 3000/4000-level (minimum of 9 at UNO). Japanese requires 15 credit hours at the 2000/3000 level (minimum of 9 at UNO). See below for the prerequisite, required and elective courses.

PLACEMENT EXAM INFORMATION:

Students with previous language experience will take a placement exam to potentially place out of some or all of the prerequisite courses. To take the exam, go to MavLINK and click on Academics, then on Register for exams. **Heritage and native speakers** do not take the placement exam and start with a 3000-level course.
