# MINORS

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A minor in French, German, Spanish, Spanish for Health Sciences, or Japanese consists of a total of 15 credit hours at the 3000/4000-level (minimum of 9 at UNO). See below for the prerequisite, required and elective courses.

## PLACEMENT EXAM INFORMATION:

Students with previous language experience will take a placement exam to potentially place out of some or all of the prerequisite courses listed above. To take the exam, go to MavLINK and click on Academics, then on Register for exams. **Heritage and native speakers** do not take the placement exam and start with a 3000-level course. Contact the department for further assistance or placement information.
