Teaching Program Alternative Permit Information and Requirements

- 1. Requirements to begin working as a school counselor with the Teaching Program Alternative Permit:**
 - Completion of 75% (**24 credit-hours**) of the School Counselor endorsement coursework completed (**or equivalent coursework and/or degree verified by the UNO Counseling department**).
 - 50% (**6 credit-hours**) of approved teacher education program coursework.

UNO Certification will process the verification paperwork for enrolled UNO students at the time the **Teaching Program Alternative Permit** application is submitted to NDE and completion of all requirements of the permit have **been verified by the Counseling department**.

The teaching program alternative permit is valid for two (2) years and is nonrenewable.
