With concentrations in building administration, special education leadership and teacher leadership, the masters and endorsement programs at UNO provide administrative certification. A doctoral degree in educational administration is a terminal degree designed to enhance leadership and develop expertise in chosen fields. Your leadership aspirations determine what EDL course blocks you will study. All EDL students are required to complete the Leadership Block, the other five blocks are customized to meet your goals.
