 - Does my area have a charging station for my laptop?
 - Are background noises limited?
- Order your MavCARD
 - Your MavCARD is your official university ID card. It is essential for all students. You will need it for:
 - Proof of identity for accessing student services and class attendance
 - Accessing Health Services and Campus Recreation
 - Receiving discounts at on-campus dining locations
 - Free access to athletic and other campus events
 - Discounts at local restaurants and vendors
 - Much more!
 - How to obtain your MavCARD:

- Go over what your first week will look like. The better prepared you are, the easier it will be. Things to consider:
 - Are you commuting to campus? Time your commute *during* the time you would normally be coming to UNO for classes. (Please note, parking may take longer during the first week)
 - Where are you going to park?
