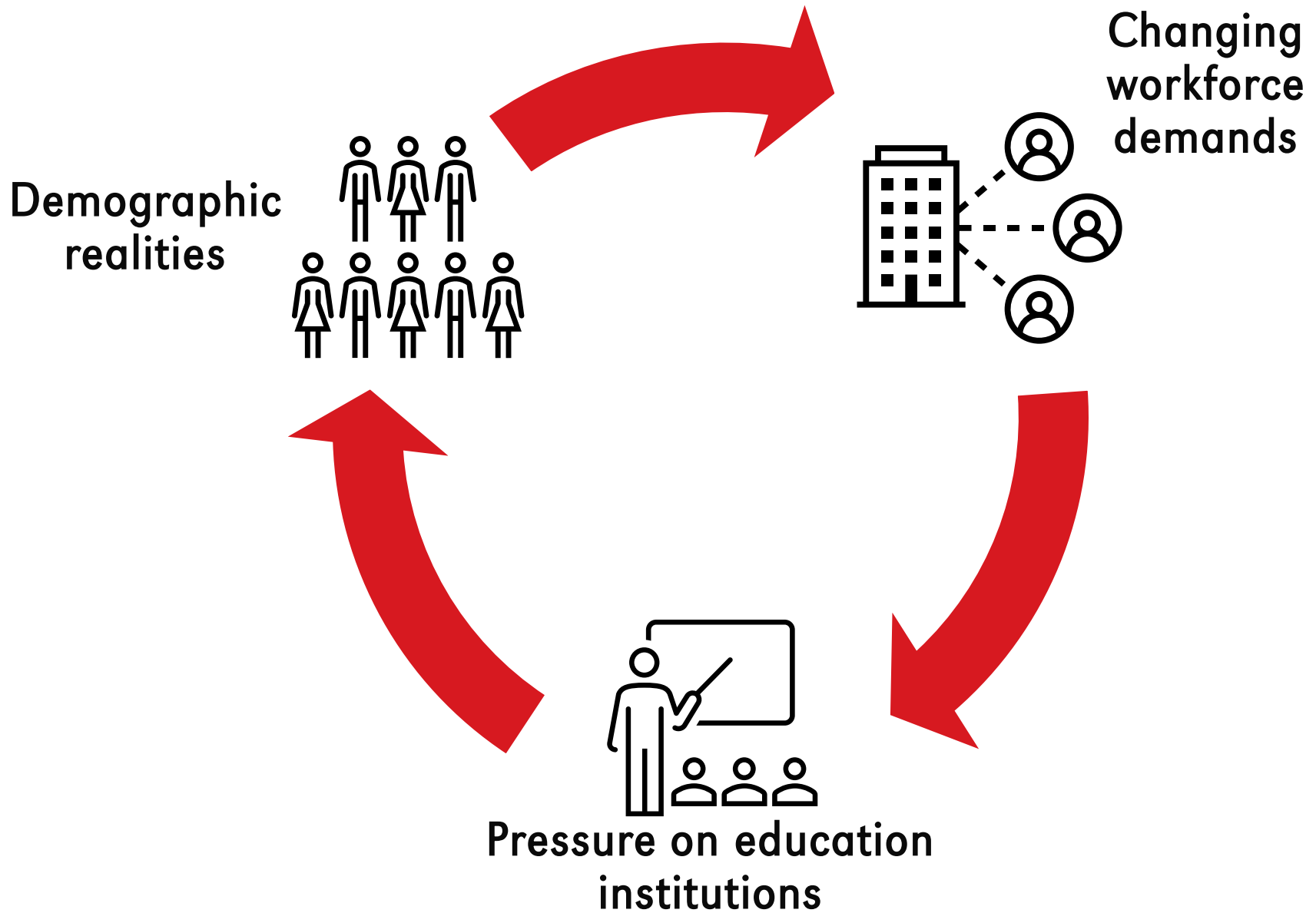

# Since 2010, Nebraska's population has increased 7.4% but 69 counties have lost population

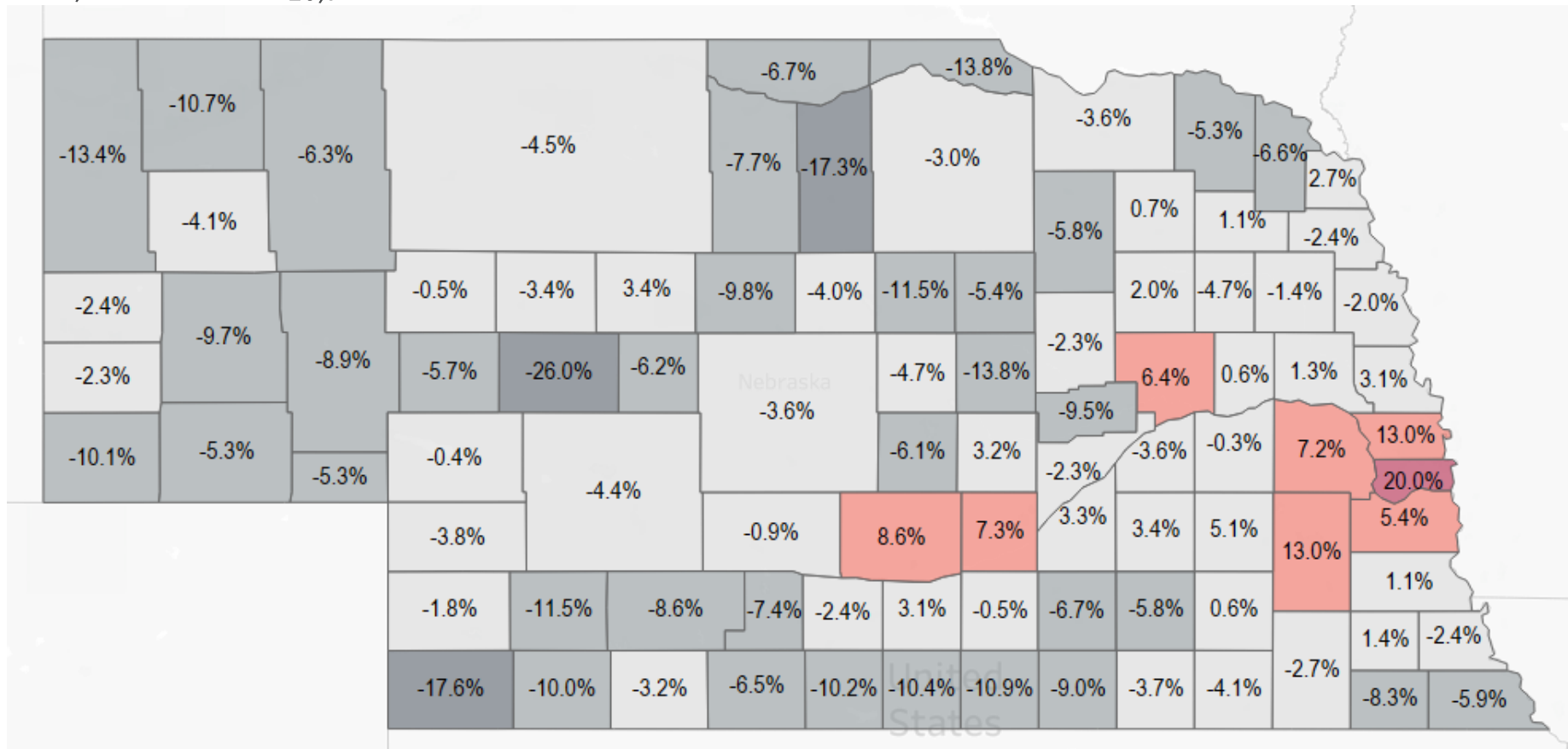
*Percent change in population 2010 – 2020*

*2020 total population = 1,961,504*



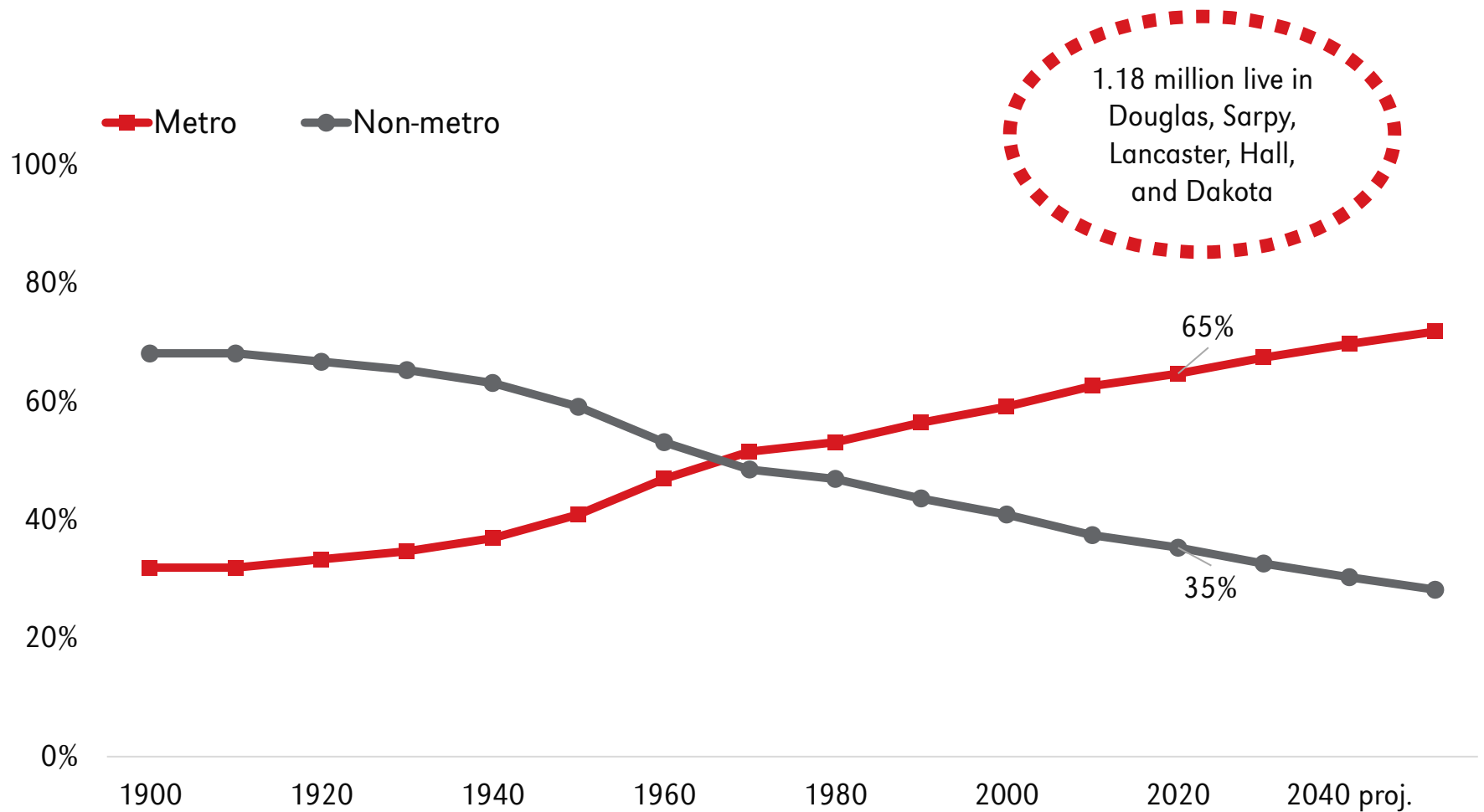

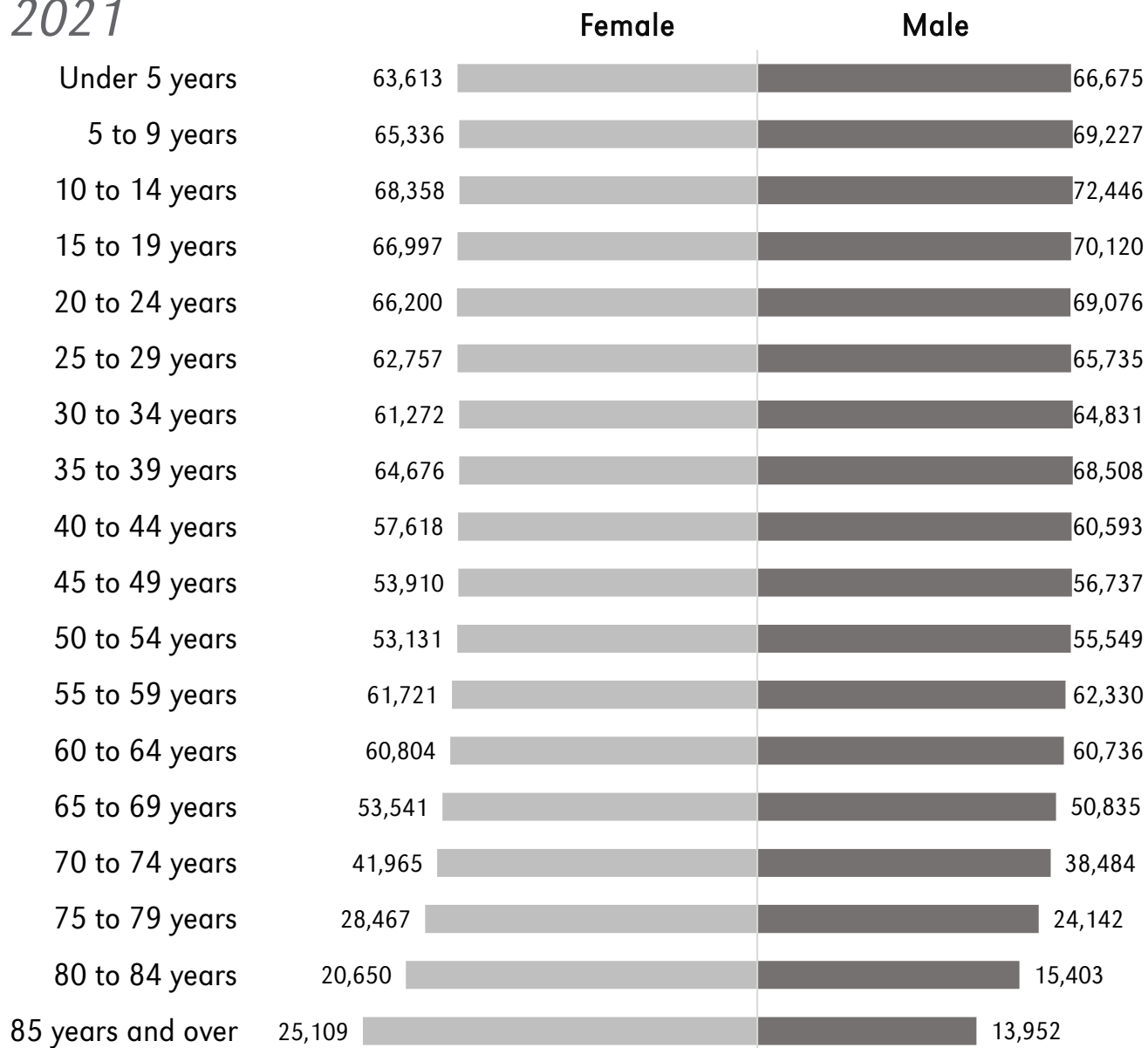
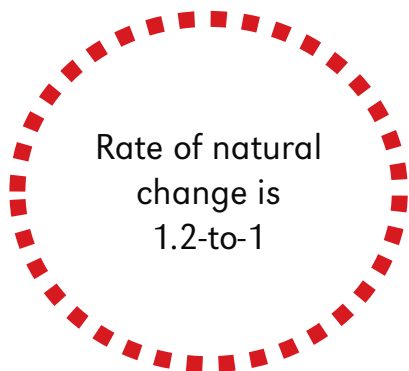
# 65% of Nebraska's population lived in a metro county in 2020

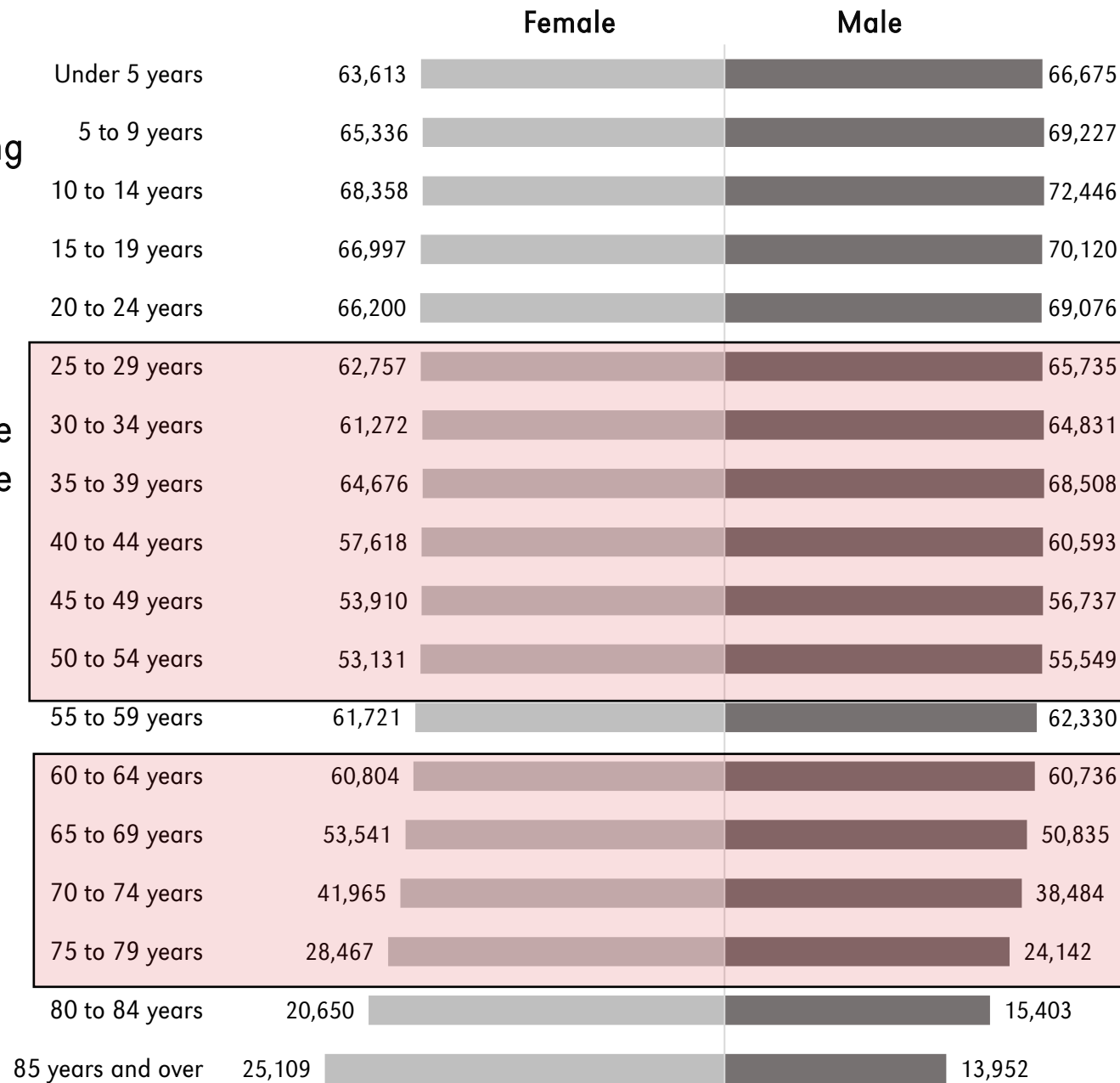

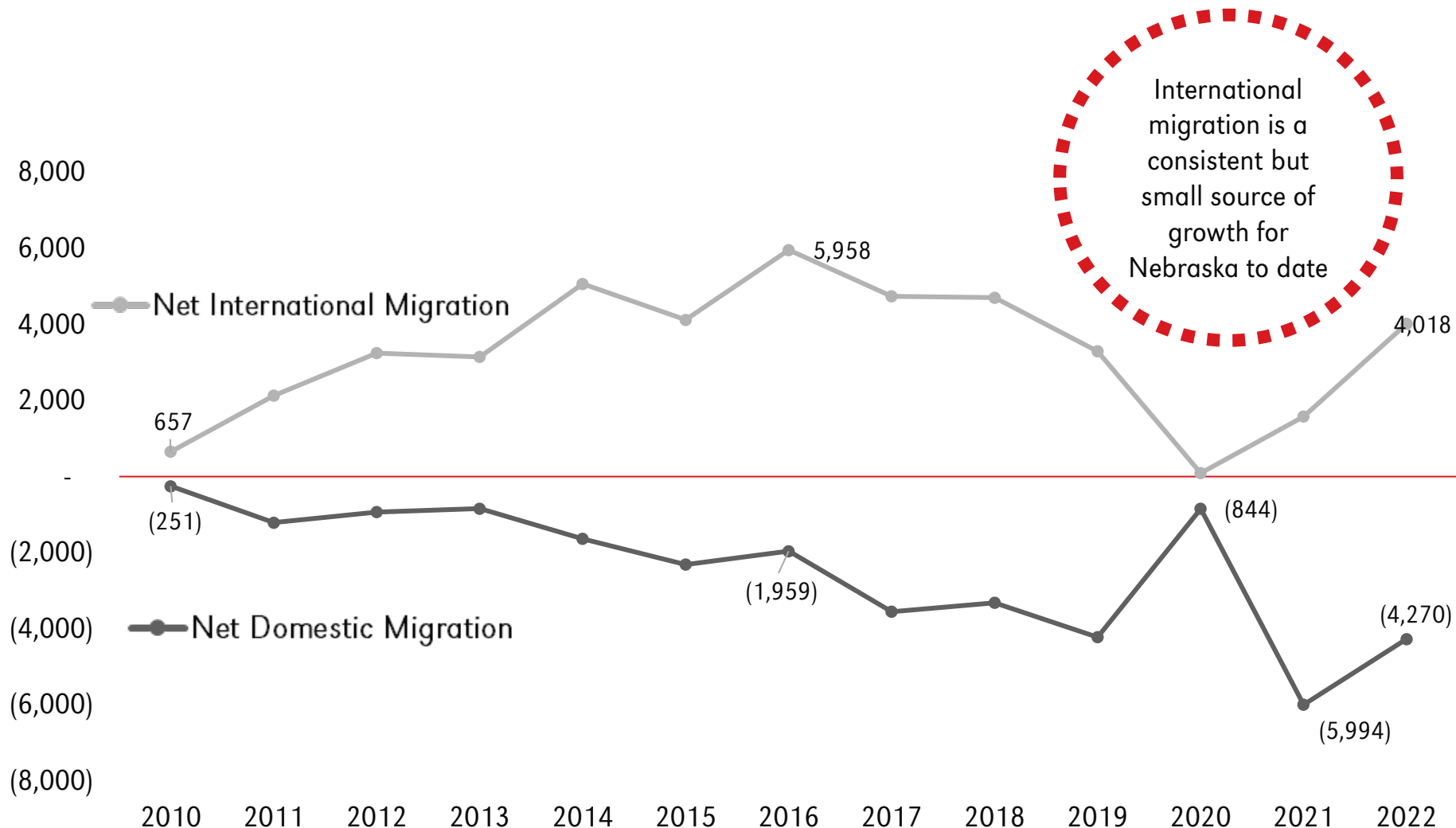

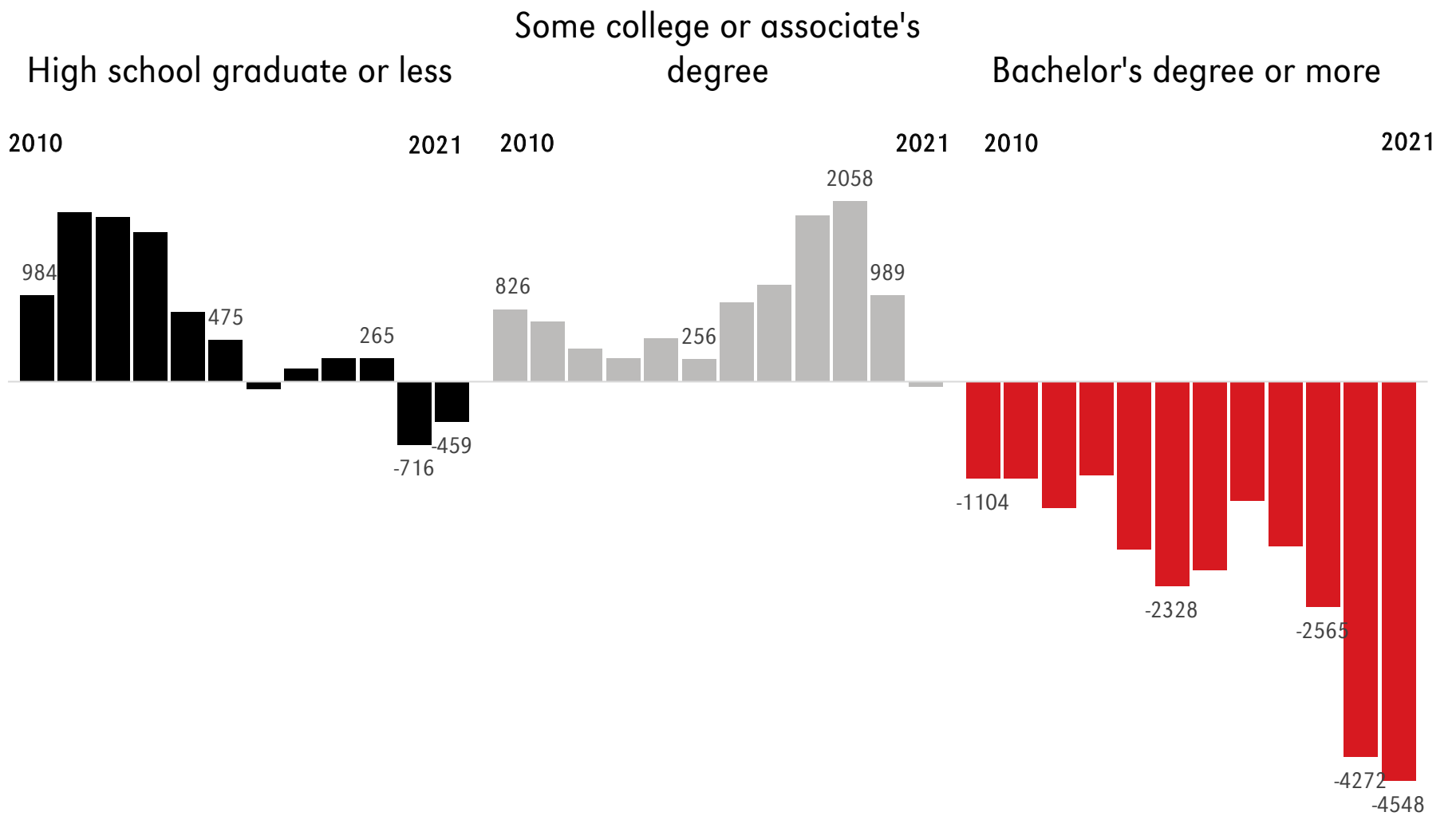
# Nebraska's growth rate is driven by natural change and mild international migration

*Components of population change 2010 to 2022*

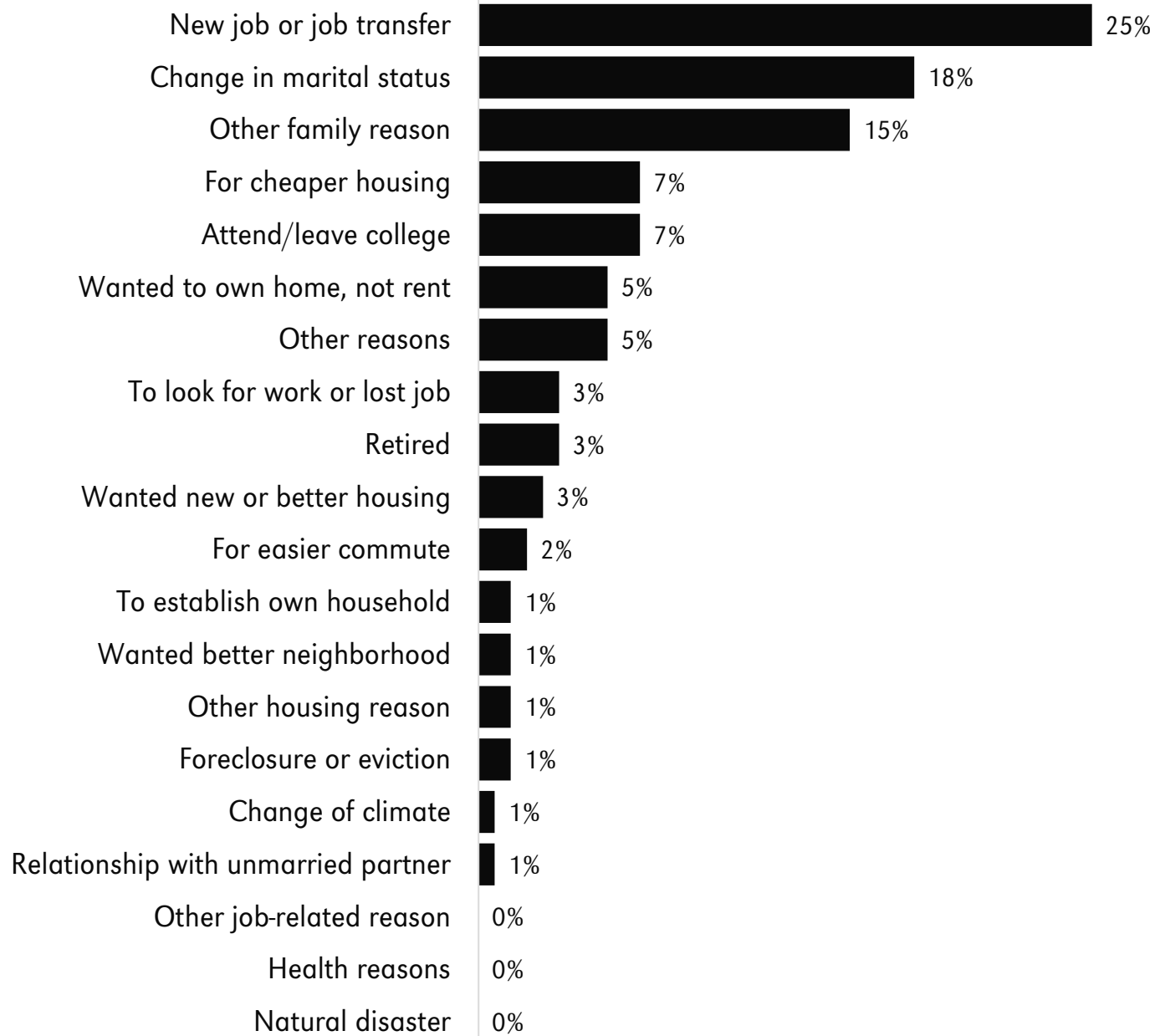


# Brain drain, or net-outmigration of persons with a bachelor's degree or more, has persisted since 2010 and the trend is negative

*Net migration by educational attainment annually 2010 to 2021*



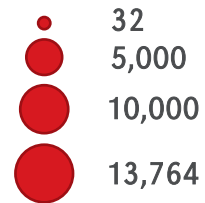
# Of Nebraskans that have moved to another state within the last year the number one reason was for a new job



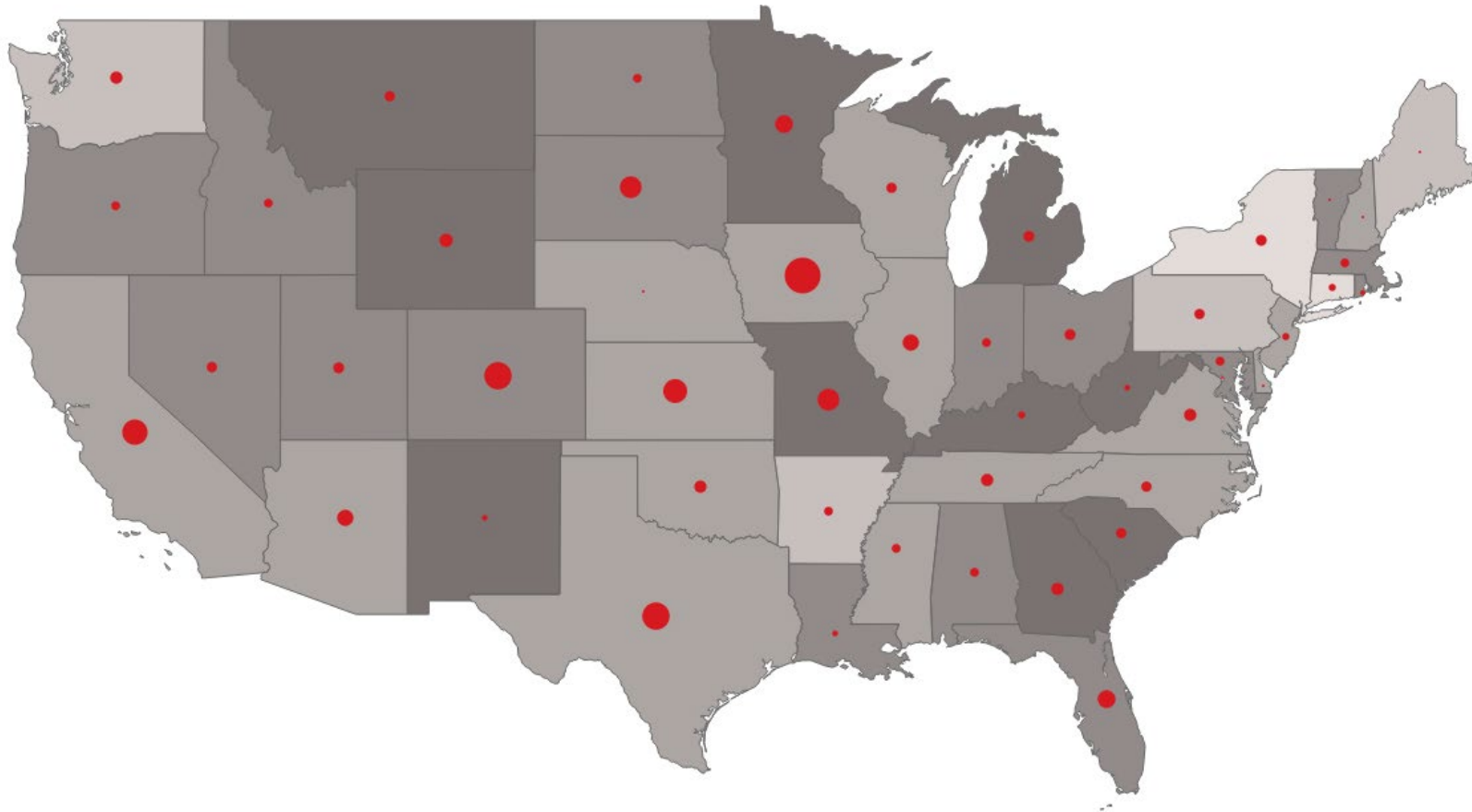
# Nebraskans are most likely to move within the Midwest and states with a high rate of job openings

Job Openings Rate



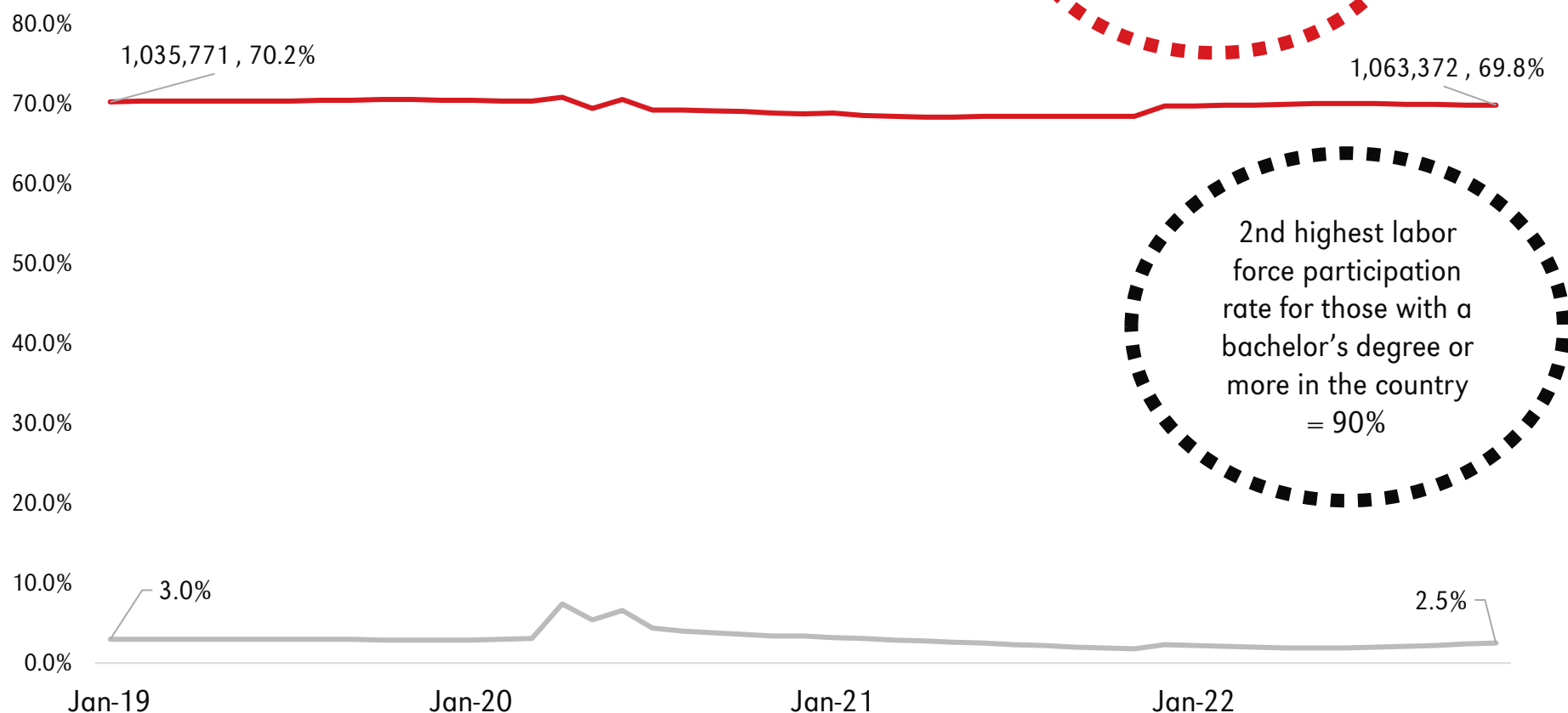

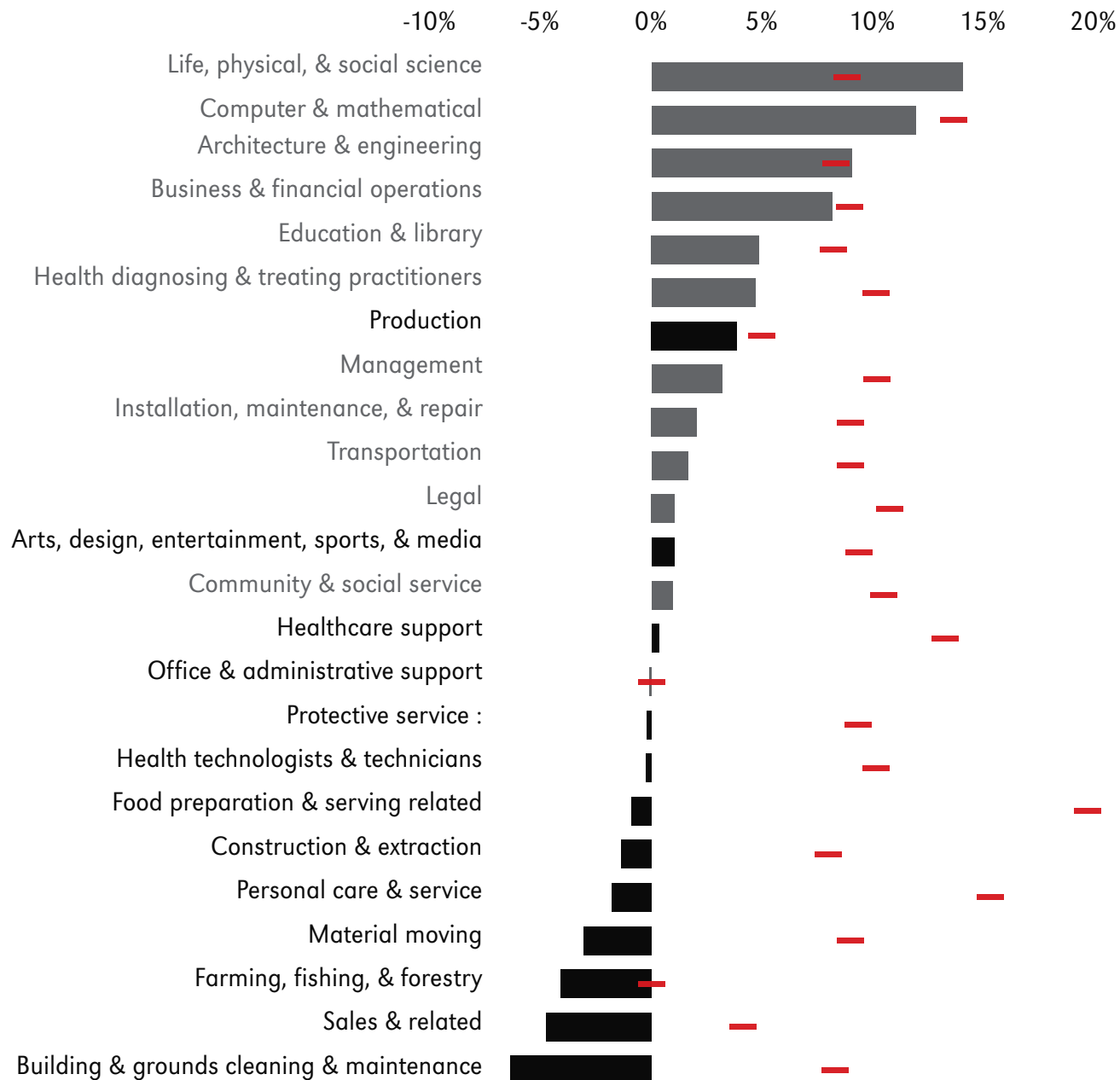

*Red line projected growth 2020 to 2030*







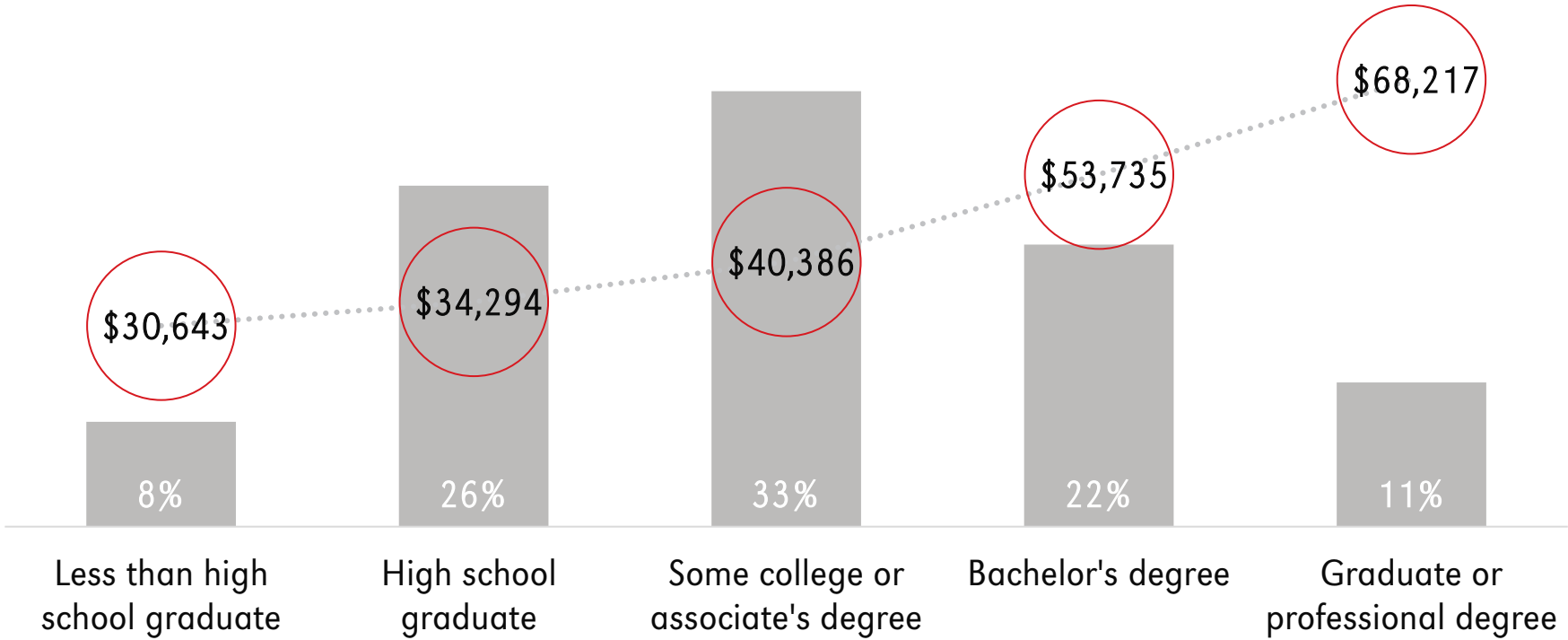

*Population 25 years and over in Nebraska*

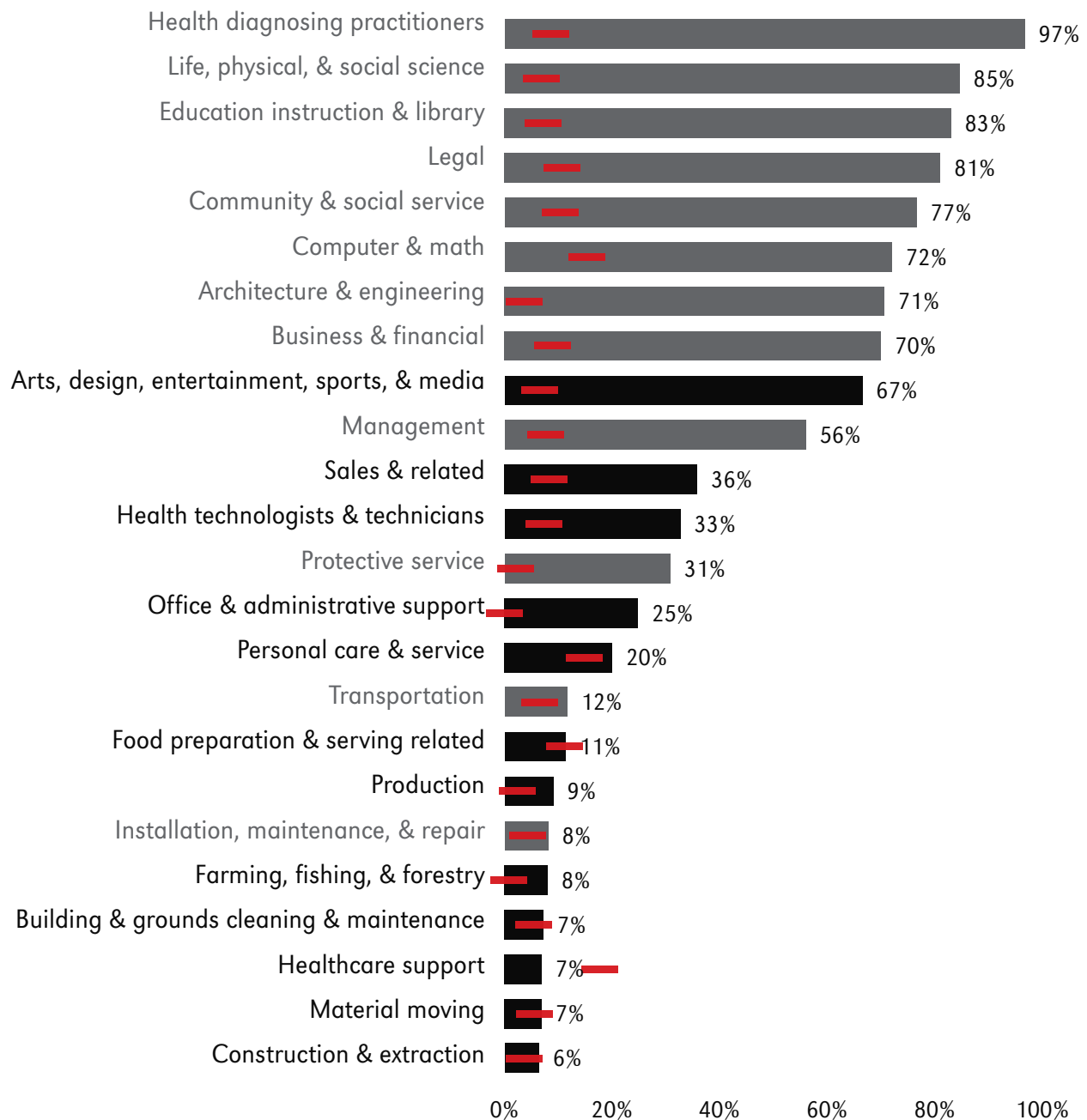
■ Educational Attainment     ●●● Median Income

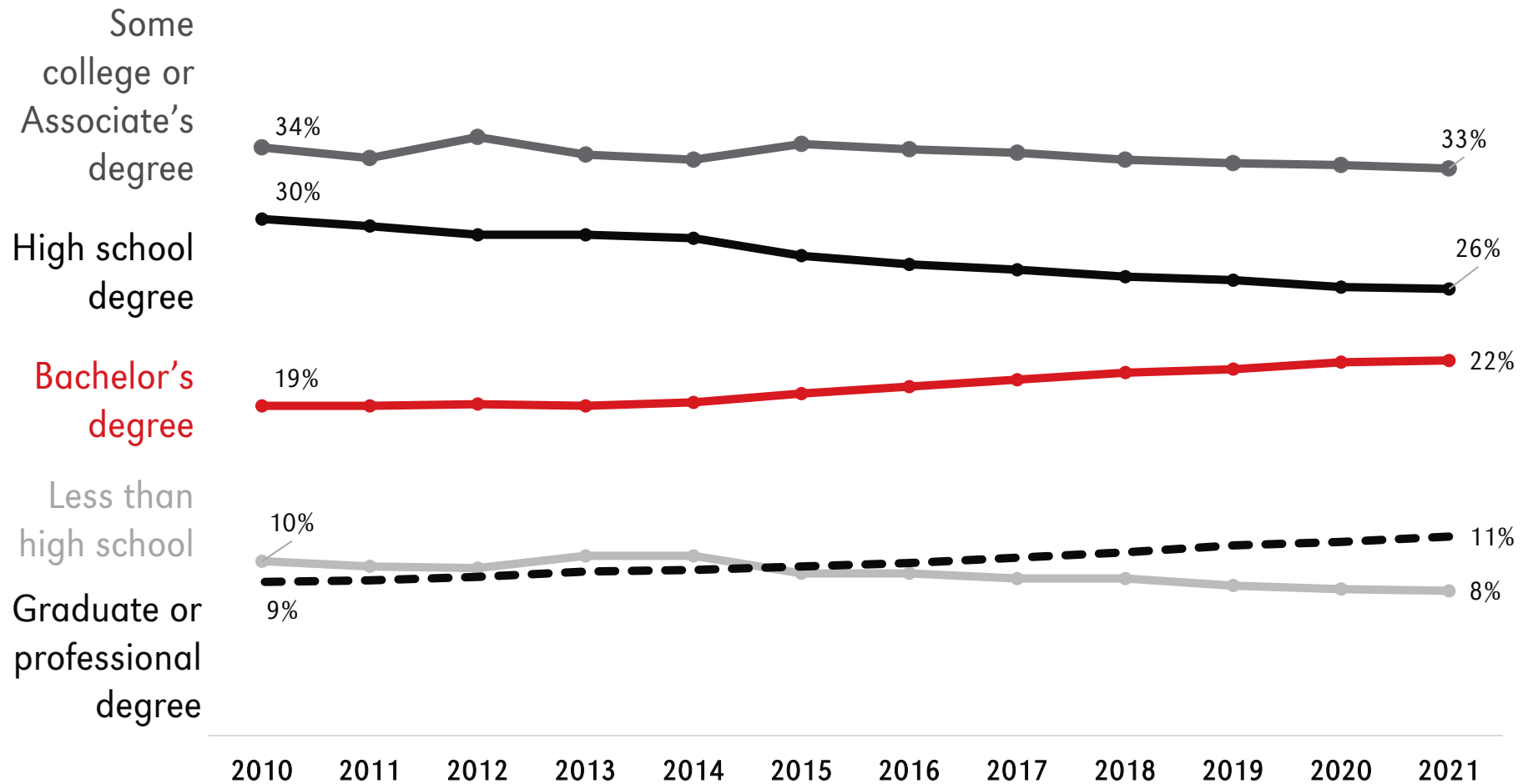

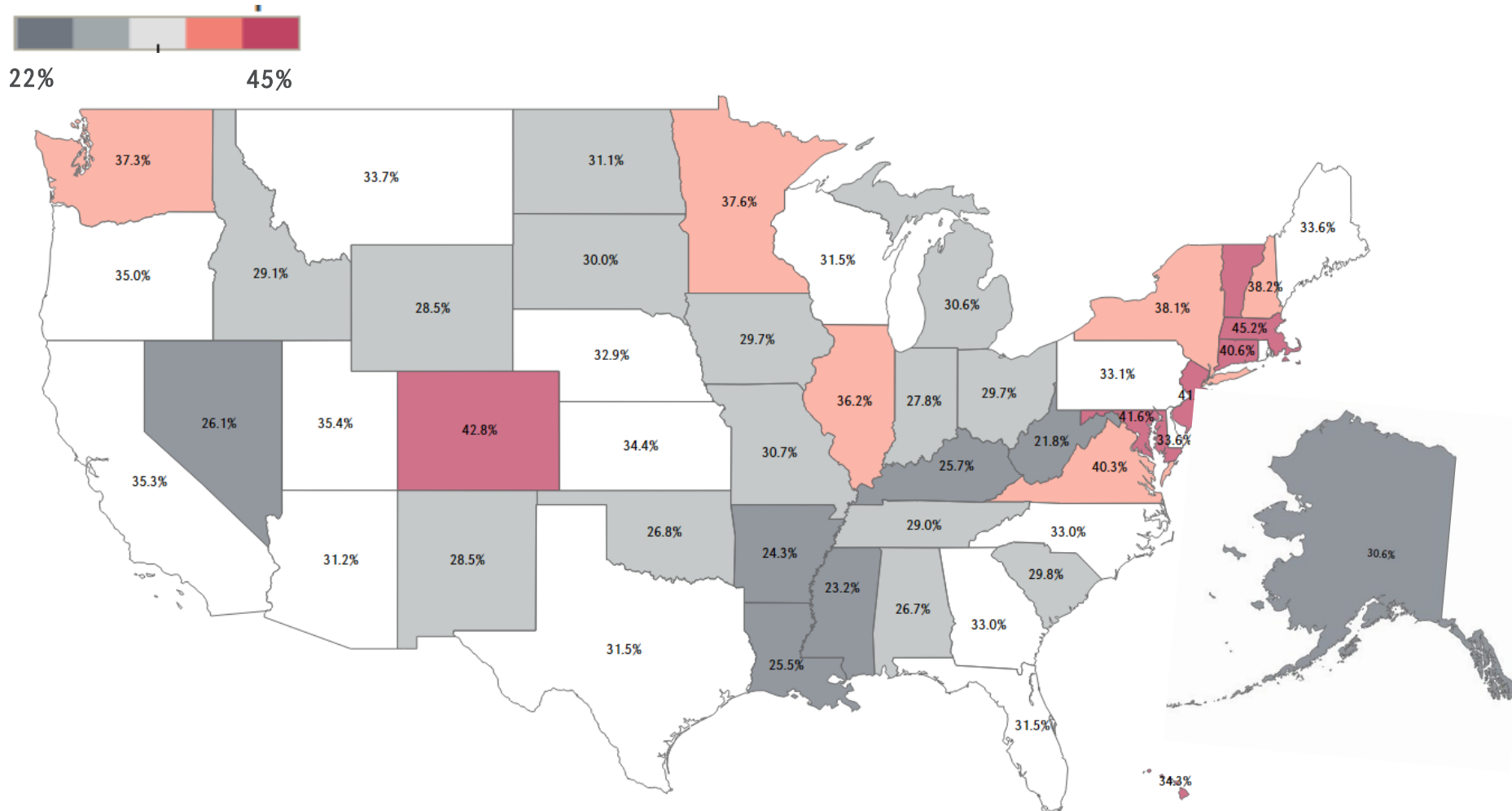

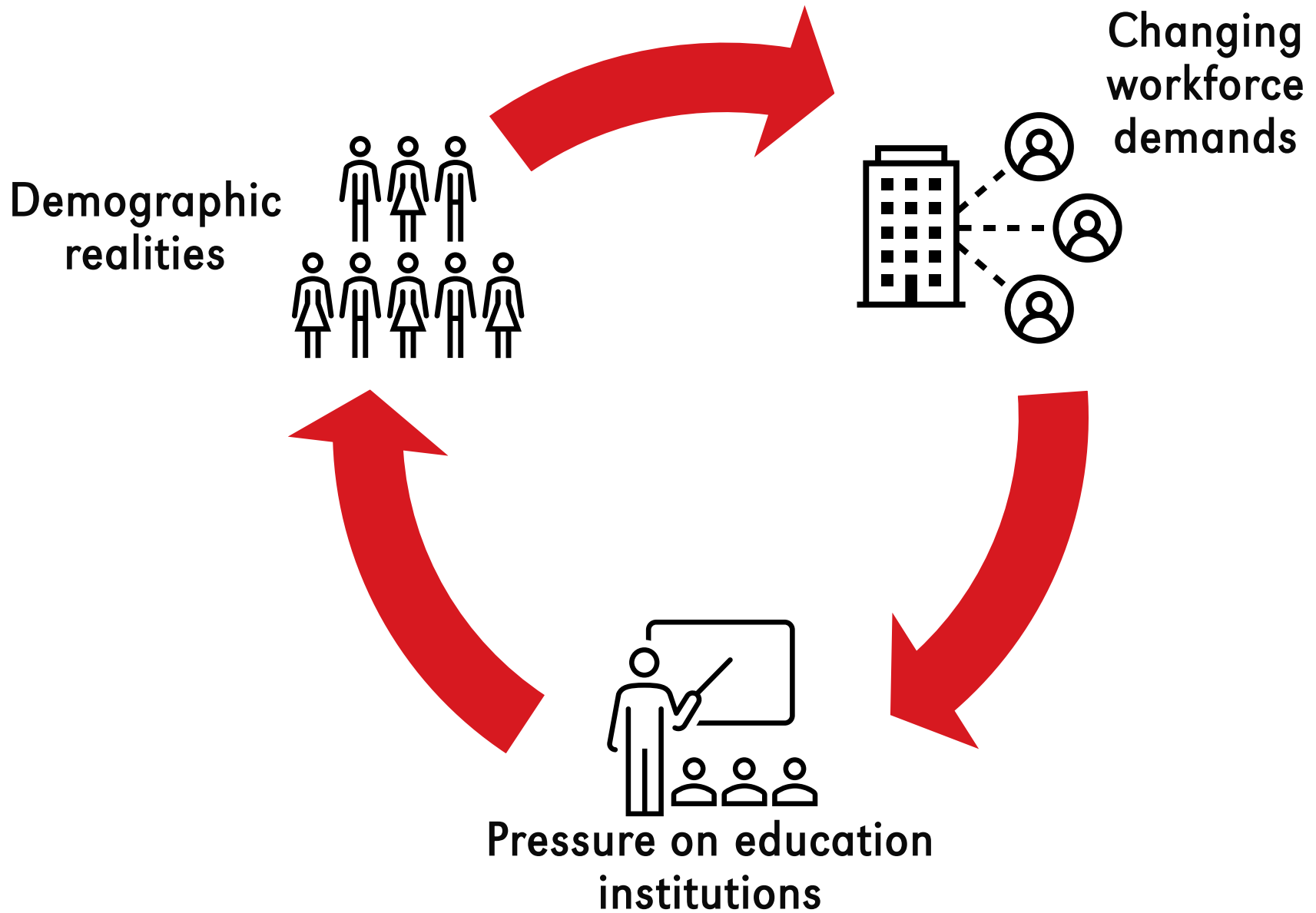
*Nebraska population 25 years and older educational attainment 2010 to 2021*
