UNDERGRADUATE LEVEL SUPPORT OPPORTUNITIES

- The **UNO SCCJ Excellence Fund** supports the School of Criminology and Criminal Justice. Funds are used at the direction of the Director and shall be administered without regard to sex, age, disability, race, color, religion, marital status, veteran status, national or ethnic origin, or sexual orientation.
- The **UNO/UNL Criminal Justice Education Scholarship** supports undergraduate and graduate students majoring in CRCJ on either the Omaha or Lincoln campus. Scholastic achievement is taken into consideration in making these awards.
- The **Knapp Scholarship Fund** supports undergraduate CRCJ majors on either the Omaha or Lincoln campus. Financial need is taken into consideration in making these awards.
- The **Webb Family Scholarship Fund** provides support to undergraduate students with senior standing majoring in CRCJ on either the Omaha or Lincoln campus, with preference given to students wanting to pursue graduate education.

- The **Deputy Chief Monroe Coleman Fund** provides support to undergraduate students majoring in CRCJ on the Omaha campus with an interest in law enforcement. Financial need is taken into consideration in making this award.
- The **Detective Kerrie Orozco First Responders Scholarship** supports undergraduate students on either the Omaha or Lincoln campus majoring in CRCJ with a desire to pursue a career as a first responder. Awards are given to Nebraska and Iowa residents with junior or senior standing who can demonstrate a record of community service. Preference in making this award is given to candidates with financial need and a GPA of at least 2.5.
- The **Joe Carroll Scholarship** is awarded to an outstanding Lincoln police officer that has reached senior standing in the CRCJ major.
- The **Jeff Marshall Scholarship Fund** provides support for CRCJ majors of junior or senior standing enrolled full-time on the Lincoln campus with a desire to work in public service.

- The **Douglas Family Scholarship Fund** provides support for CRCJ majors of junior or senior standing attending classes on the Lincoln campus with a GPA of 3.0 or above. Recipients need to have graduated from a Nebraska high school with preference being given to students with demonstrated financial need.

GRADUATE LEVEL SUPPORT OPPORTUNITIES

- The **Dennis Roncek Memorial Fellowship Fund** provides one or more fellowships to graduate students majoring in the School of Criminology and Criminal Justice to be applied to tuition, fees, books and/or supplies.
- The **Dr. Benjamin Steiner Fellowship for Criminal Justice Professional Fund Scholarship** benefits a student who is/was a working professional in the criminal justice field during or prior to earning his/her master's or doctoral degree. This scholarship was established in memory of Ben Steiner, Ph.D., who dedicated his life to teaching and improving the criminal justice system through his scholarly work.
