UNO's Senior Learning Passport Program

The Senior Learning Passport Program is available to citizens who are at least 65 years of age. Senior learners may attend and "sit-in" on undergraduate courses (courses numbered 1000 - 4999) on a space available basis and with the instructor's permission. Online courses are not available for Passport Learners.

The Learning Passport may be used for up to two classes per semester and is valid for one year from the date of the non-refundable \$25 fee payment.

Please complete the [Senior Learning Passport Program Form](#) and submit it to the Office of the University Registrar, Eppley 105 after you have received instructor permission.

Senior Passport Program Guidelines:

- Non-refundable fee for this program is \$25 per year and covers a maximum of 2 classes per semester
- Limited to undergraduate classes on a space available basis
- Citizens 65 years of age and over are eligible
- Instructor permission is required for all classes
- Not eligible to take online classes or receive any UNO services
- The passport learner is intended to be a passive learner. Any active participation is at the discretion of the instructor and the instructor may terminate participation of a learner for any reason.
- Pacific St. Garage and West Garage are available for daily/hourly parking with the ParkOmaha app or kiosks. The ParkOmaha app and daily permits are available and valid ONLY after 12:30 P.M. in all levels of the East Garage. Advanced purchase, full-day permits are available online.
- Learner must return this [form](#) to the Office of the University Registrar, Eppley 105, after you have received instructor permission/signature.

The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (OLLI at UNL) is an adult learning membership program for men and women age 50 years plus. OLLI at UNL is one of more than a hundred Osher Lifelong Learning Institutes across the United States. OLLI at UNL partners with and is supported by the College of Education and Human Sciences to provide stimulating and varied opportunities.

HOW IS OLLI FUNDED?

Programming is funded by interest from a Bernard Osher Foundation endowment, course and membership fees, and donations from OLLI members and others.

WHAT DOES OLLI OFFER?

OLLI offers over 244 courses and events each year in five terms. Along with great courses, enjoy many social and cultural events, interest groups and travel both near and far.

Membership is required to take courses, attend special events and take advantage of other OLLI opportunities.

With your membership, you may enroll in as many courses as you like. Most courses are:

- 6 weeks long
- 90 minutes per meeting, once per week
- Offered during the day or evening, Monday-Saturday
- Shorter courses and one-time classes are also available.

MEMBERSHIP FEES

Choose from one of the following membership options:

- Annual membership (August-July) is \$75.
- Mid-year membership (January-July) is \$50.

Discounts on Membership:

- If you are a member of NET, you can save \$10 on an annual membership.
- If you are a first-time NEW OLLI member and a member of the UNL Alumni Association, you can save \$10 on an annual membership.

No discounts are available on the mid-year membership.

OTHER FEES

OLLI offers multi-session courses, as well as one-time classes, symposia and lectures. A typical one-time class is \$5 and a typical six-week course is \$30. Fees for events, day trips and travel vary.
