■ INCLUDE A RESUME

☐ TAKE THE TOEFL/IELTS (INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS)

TOEFL minimum score of 557 (or 233 on computer based test of 90 on internet test)
Or: minimum IELTS score of 6.5, a minimum Pearson score of 6.1, or Duolingo score of 1.10 or higher

□ SUBMIT A STATEMENT OF PURPOSE (ESSAY)

In a five-page statement of intent, describe the following:
The career you wish to pursue after completion of the PhD
Desired area of specialization
Faculty with whom you would like to work
Explanation of academic and professional backgrounds and interests

☐ SUBMIT WRITING SAMPLES

Academic or professional writing sample (such as a term paper, thesis, conference paper, evaluation report, or published work)
1-page abstract summarizing the contents of the writing sample

■ SUBMIT THREE LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Provide the names and email addresses of three individuals who can address your qualifications for graduate study.

The recommenders will be sent an online recommendation form to complete. At least two recommendations must be academics.
