Library Resources for Students

One of the many perks to being a Dual Enrollment student is getting to use the UNO Criss Library online databases, as well as the physical resources in the buildings.

To access these resources, students must set up a library account by following these steps:

- 1. Click on "My Account" dropdown option under "My Account" tab in the upper left side of the UNO Library homepage.
- 2. Click on 'set/reset password'
- 3. Enter NU ID, followed by your email. Follow the link sent to your email.
- 4. When prompted for your NU ID number, use the 8-digit number given PLUS 'de' at the end. Example: 12345678de

Once the library account is set up, students can access all of the online databases, and any e-books in the catalog. For more information, visit:

Teachers can already have a Master's degree in a non-government/history/political science/etc. field such as a Master's in Education. - a. 2017-2018: General education courses in the <u>humanities and fine arts</u> distribution area.
- b. 2018-2019: General education courses in the <u>U.S.</u> and <u>global diversity</u> distribution areas.

The 2017-2018 General Education Assessment Guide found here provides detailed expectations and instructions for completing your course assessment reports. Each academic unit at UNO with courses that meet humanities and fine arts requirements will need to submit assessment reports for these courses by May 11, 2018 using the general education assessment template.
