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Spring Growth

This spring we have successfully visited and enrolled students at 35 high schools. As of early March, we have enrolled 1,631 students in 2,212 dual enrollment courses and that number continues to rise. This is equivalent to earning 7,612 UNO college credit hours.

"Dual Enrollment continues to grow in both size and quality."

Spring enrollment has a seen a 5.3% increase in total credit hours earned from last spring. For high school students, these credits can be the difference between going on to college after high school graduation or not. Many students are unsure of whether or not they are capable of succeeding in a college course until they see themselves successfully completing a Dual Enrollment course.

For the past two years, high school students enrolled in AP^(R) Human Geography courses at Benson, Bryan, and Omaha South High schools have been reading Margaret Atwood's Oryx & Crake. Rather than just memorizing items for the national exam on May 18, 2018, students can actually exercise their Human Geography knowledge. Atwood's dystopian novel is set against a rich apocalyptic cultural landscape, enabling students to observe, analyze, and evaluate Earth's [potential] future through the multi-faceted lens of Human Geography, Maria Walinski-Peterson travels to all three high schools each month to meet with students in small groups. This experience enriches their collective and individual understandings of the discipline because

they must <u>immerse</u> themselves in its dynamics. Atwood's exercise in world building has proven to be a powerful tool for studying Human Geography.

ACE Scholarship

Dual Enrollment students still have time to apply for the Access College Early (ACE) scholarship through the State of Nebraska. Students will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis. As of March 22, 2018 there is still funding available, but students need to submit their application ASAP. If approved, this scholarship can pay for up to two dual enrollment courses per year.

Three ways to qualify:

- Student qualifies for free or reduced lunch or other need based government program
- Student or family experienced a financial hardship
- Student is participating in a designated career education program.

Calculus: The Musical & Calculus Bee



The General Education Assessment Committee has established a regular cycle of academic assessment for general education courses offered on campus at UNO.

- 1. 2017-2018: General education courses in the <u>humanities and fine arts</u> distribution area.
- 2. 2018-2019: General education courses in the U.S. and global diversity distribution areas.

The 2017-2018 General Education Assessment Guide found <u>here</u> provides detailed expectations and instructions for completing your course assessment reports. Each academic unit at UNO with courses that meet humanities and fine arts requirements will need to submit assessment reports for these courses by May 11, 2018 using the general education assessment <u>template</u>.
