

Student Admit Packet

You should have received an admit packet in the mail. If you did not, please call our office at 402-554-3810 and we will make sure one is mailed to you. The packet contains your course information, along with your NUID. Your NUID is your login for MavLINK, UNO's student portal. We recommend that you keep the schedule and admit packet with your academic records for future reference, especially when applying for college. You may also view the admit packet online.



FERPA and Dual Enrollment

The Family and Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) is a federal law that gives protection to student educational records and provides students with certain rights. The law assigns the student as the owner of their educational record and provides guidelines on how the educational institution is to use and release protected information. Students may allow their parent/guardian the ability to discuss their UNO academic records with UNO staff by submitting a FERPA release form.

We strongly recommend to students that they complete the FERPA release form and return it to our office, as many of your parents call to speak on your behalf.

MavLINK and NUID

Your NUID (Nebraska Unique Identifier) is your student ID and login ID for MavLINK. When you are dual enrolled, you will receive 2 emails from TrueYou. One email with your NUID and the second email will contain a temporary password. You will have to set up a permanent password so that you can access the student portal, MavLINK. In MavLINK, you can see your course schedule, request a transcript, and pay your bill.

Paying Your Bill

The cost for Dual Enrollment is \$250.00 per course. One (1) credit hour courses are \$160.00. You can pay either via the US mail with a check, in person or online. Please go to our Costs and Billing page for payment options. Payment plans are available, please call Cashiering at 402-554-2324.

Withdrawal Dates and Policies

Info for the 2022 AP® Exam Prep Sessions

AP® Exam Prep Sessions

In collaboration with Academic Departments and valued high school faculty & staff, the 2022 sessions will be offered in a digital format. Advanced Placement is administered by the College Board®.

The cost of the Advanced Placement® exam is included in the dual enrollment fee. UNO Dual Enrollment does not require students to take the exam in order to receive UNO Dual Enrollment credit. However, your high school may require that you take the exam. Please check with your high school on their requirements.



Universities and colleges will only accept an Official Transcript sent directly from UNO.

Requesting a Transcript

Transcripts contain academic information such as course work, grades, credit hours earned and grade point average. All official transcript requests are processed by the Office of the University Registrar. Please <u>click here</u> to learn more about requesting a transcript and transferring credits.

Please note: if you will be attending UNL, UNK or UNMC after high school, you will still need to request that an Official Transcript be sent to these institutions from UNO's Office of the Registrar.

Seniors: Prior to your academic advising session/orientation for your freshman year, please request, well in advance, that an Official Transcript be sent to your university or college. Also, to ensure that your dual credit is reviewed by your advisor, it is a good idea to bring an Official or Unofficial Transcript with you to your advising appointment. You can generate an Unofficial Transcript via your MavLINK account.
