WHAT IS CCSW?

The Chancellor's Commission on the Status of Women (CCSW) is an advisory council to the chancellor and other university administrators on issues that relate to women students, faculty, and staff at the University of Nebraska Omaha (UNO). CCSW monitors the status of women on the UNO campus and recommends ways of improving that status. The Commission is comprised of volunteers from the faculty, staff, and students, and serves more than 15,000 students and 1,200 faculty and staff.

In order to encourage the full participation of women in the university, steps must be taken to identify and eliminate the disadvantages that women face. UNO cannot afford to have its students, faculty or staff working at a disadvantage.

OUR GOAL

Our goal is to provide a forum for women at UNO in conjunction with the organization's core themes: awareness of women's issues, balance in women's lives, and community and women's roles.

Membership in the CCSW is open to all faculty, staff, and students who reflect diversity in: culture, age, gender, academic unit(s), university department(s), and support services.

- Arranging activities and programs that bring awareness of women's issues to the campus community
- Presenting an award to an undergraduate student in recognition for improving the status of women or gender issues or have academic excellence in fields in which women are underrepresented

- Supporting the establishment of daycare facilities for students, faculty, and staff
- Identifying pay inequities between male and female faculty
- Initiating and implementing a program to combat sexual harassment on campus
