### INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADVISING

International Student Advising helps current and new international students get oriented to campus, stay informed about and compliant with important academic immigration-related matters, and get involved on campus and in the community. UNO's International Student Advisors have many years of experience in advising students and exchange visitors from all over the world.

If you have a problem or question, just ask an advisor.

Keep in mind, International Student Advisors are not Academic Advisors. Make an appointment with your academic advisor when you need to choose and/or enroll in classes.

### ILUNO INTENSIVE ENGLISH

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Intensive English (ILUNO) students collaborate with program instructors to evaluate their English ability and select language classes at one of six levels, from beginning to advanced classes. Experienced instructors teach Reading, Writing, and Grammar; Listening & Speaking; and elective classes on a variety of topics. Students take a placement test when they arrive to make sure that the classes are the best fit for students' English level. ILUNO instructors are available daily for appointments with students to discuss their class work, language skills, and future academic plans. ILUNO students receive personalized assistance and orientation services from a dedicated International Student Advising team.



### EDUCATION ABROAD

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The Education Abroad Office supports students from start to finish during their study abroad experience. Studying abroad is one of the best investments that students can make for their future. It gives them the opportunity to explore new locations and ideas, broaden perspectives, and grow both academically and personally. Faculty and staff can help students by promoting Education Abroad in their classroom, assist with course approvals, and even create a study abroad program! ### INTERNATIONAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (IPD)

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International Professional Development (IPD) is an intensive, eight-week professional training program focusing on three areas: English language, intercultural communication, and leadership skills. Participants enter the program at a high-intermediate or low-advanced English proficiency level and come from business, medicine, education, technology, etc. IPD uses a total immersion approach in addition to time spent both in the classroom and observing businesses or community organizations. Each participant is paired with a local mentor and the two meet several times throughout the session to discuss professional topics. IPD participants prepare a capstone presentation on their area of expertise and share with a diverse audience. IPD participants can live with American host families to deepen their cultural understanding and practice English outside of the classroom.
