 - a. Double dipping concerns with major how to respond and what language should be used?
 - b. Courses fitting in more than one category
 - i. Difference between humanities and cultural knowledge?
 - c. Should *any* course in a particular area count for gen ed breadth (e.g. any history course for humanities, and Chem course for Nat Sci
- 3. Relevant language used at system peers related to questions above
 - a. Any ACE course may be approved to address a maximum of two ACE Student Learning Outcomes (UNL).
 - b. Up to three ACE Student Learning Outcomes 4-10 may be satisfied by work in one subject area (UNL).
 - c. ACE Student Learning Outcomes must be satisfied by work in at least three subject areas (UNL).
 - d. If an ACE course addresses two ACE Student Learning Outcomes, the student decides which one of the two Outcomes the course will satisfy in that student's program (UNL).
 - e. A student may not take more than 3 courses with the same department/ discipline prefix in their General Education program. Lecture/lab combinations from a single department that must be taken as co-requisites count as one course for this rule (UNK).
 - f. Designated courses with the appropriate content will satisfy one of the Broad Knowledge requirements (LOPERs 5-8) plus LOPER 9 or a Broad Knowledge requirement plus LOPER 10. A student who satisfies LOPER 9 or LOPER 10 with a course that also meets another requirement will have 3 hours of elective General Education credits in the 30-hour program. A student who satisfies both LOPERs 9 and 10 with courses that also meet other requirements will have 6 hours of credit to take any other general education course of interest (UNK).
