

# UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT OMAHA GENERAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE Minutes – October 17<sup>th</sup> 2025

## Discussion Items:

- 1. Grade Nudge Trainings
  - A presenter introduced the Grade Nudge trainings, a software tool that sends
    personalized grade-related information to students, offering incentives for faculty
    adoption. The committee discussed the implementation of Grade Nudge and
    addressed concerns about its focus on grades versus learning content. Ben clarified
    that grades can be used as an incentive to encourage desired learning behaviors.

## 2. CIM

- a. Gen Ed CIM info updated
- Includes the new course approval form and uploading the document directly into the course system
- b. Button added in CIM for voting
- Primary committee members will cast votes on course proposals. Denise explained the voting process and noted that courses requiring further discussion will be carried over to the next month
- 3. MavEd Course Proposal Form
  - Updates to course proposal forms and rubrics. Changes were made to align requirements more closely and make them more explicit, including separating integrative learning and reflection into distinct rubric lines and proposal sections
  - Discussion on strategies for supporting faculty in teaching writing and speaking
    across disciplines, focus on providing resources and maintaining academic freedom.
    Committee will review course proposals and evaluation forms, with feedback due by
    the end of the following week.
