What is integrative learning, and why does it matter to MavEd?

Integrative learning is the ability to synthesize knowledge and skills from multiple sources, disciplines, or experiences, and apply them to new, complex, or real-world situations. This is one of the three transferable learning outcomes that must be embedded in every general education course.

To fully realize this outcome, courses will typically require students to:

- Synthesize knowledge: by drawing connections across disciplines, weaving together concepts, skills, and experiences to develop a more holistic understanding of complex issues
- Focus on real-world application: by transferring knowledge into real-life setting whether personal, professional, or civic to demonstrate relevance beyond the classroom.
- Reflect on learning: by articulating how their learning experiences influence their beliefs, decisions, and future actions. Through reflective and adaptive thinking, they critically examine and express how what they've learned may shape their personal growth, inform professional pathways,

Supports Lifelong Learning

Integrative learning includes reflective thinking, helping students better understand how their experiences, identities, and goals shape their learning and decisions.



Meets Employer Expectations

Employers increasingly seek graduates who can apply interdisciplinary thinking, adapt to new situations, and make informed decisions in uncertain or changing environments

Integrative learning equips students to make meaningful connections across disciplines, experiences, and contexts, enabling them to navigate complexity with insight and adaptability. By emphasizing real-world application and reflective thinking, it transforms general education into a powerful foundation for lifelong learning, responsible citizenship, and professional success.
