FALL COMPETENCY BASED EDUCATION (CBE) PILOT *(ONGOING OPPORTUNITY)

CBE focuses on student learning and the application of that learning—what they know and can do—with greater flexibility than the traditional time constructs of a class. While we will still schedule all courses at UNO within the current framework of existing semesters, we are eager to identify pedagogical strategies that allow students greater flexibility in moving through course content as they master concepts. HYFLEX & FLIPPED CLASSROOM

There are several options for designing courses that combine in-person and online components. Hyflex combines hybrid with flexibility, providing an opportunity to reach more students and accommodate the 21st century student. In flipped classrooms students learn fundamental knowledge prior to class through online components, and expand upon that knowledge through activities conducted during class. Join us for workshops focused on effective ways to implement these course design models.

HUMANIZING ONLINE *(ONGOING OPPORTUNITY)

Our Humanizing Online Series applies science and culturally responsive teaching to online courses to create an inclusive, equitable class climate for today's diverse students. In these courses participants learn how to 1) improve the accessibility of your Canvas for many types of content and tools, 2) create a more engaging, equitable, and inclusive class and 3) design and facilitate humanized and connected online learning communities.

AI & CHAT GPT

AI and ChatGPT are new tools that aren't going anywhere; how can we use them effectively? In a series of workshops, we'll discuss ways that you can use ChatGPT to enhance your classroom, help students build skills for the future, and help you work more efficiently as well as how AI may require us to think outside the box in how we assess students and mitigate student usage for cheating.

ACADEMIC TECH QUICK BYTES

Quick Bytes are 30-minute sessions will focus on specific tasks within our academic technology. Each session will consist of a basic overview and leave time for you to ask questions.

DIGITAL BADGING PILOT VIA CANVAS CREDENTIALS

The ILCI division is responding to broad interest in digital badging coming from a variety of colleges, department and units across the UNO campus, so will be leading a pilot of Canvas Credentials this Fall. Digital badges allow students to easily articulate skills and competencies they have earned through a variety of learning experiences at UNO and connect them to future opportunities. Likewise, digital badges help employers more easily identify students who have verified mastery of an in-demand skillset.
