### **Program Activities:**

According to the project objectives, UNO was required to conduct a gender seminar for the program participants to enhance their knowledge and awareness in gender related issues in their academic environment to provide an equal opportunity to male and female students and colleagues in all parts of their educational affairs.

The UNO office in Kabul worked to design a comprehensive and inclusive intensive training program to cover most of gender issues relevant to the educational purposes for KPU professor based on the availability of the professors and their teaching schedule.

UNO Kabul office recruited a qualified professor who is currently teaching in the Gender Master's Degree Program at Kabul University as a facilitator, along with UNO training coordinator to design and conduct a short inclusive training program for four days.

Based on the objectives of the gender training concepts, training materials were designed for four days. Later on, training materials and outline were shared with USWDP's gender department to get their feedback and concerns regarding the course contents.

Twelve MHHS professors and the faculty executive officer took part in the seminar. Due to busy schedule of the



professors in the morning, the seminar time was planned between 2:00 pm and 4:30 pm every day for two and half hours.
