

As an undergraduate living away from family, when I shared the variety/selection of food available at the pantry, they were assured and found comfort in knowing that I was eating well.

If the food pantry didn't exist, I honestly don't know what I would have done. I would have had to skip meals just to get by. It would've been a real struggle to balance basic needs like food with other expenses like rent and transportation. The pantry helped relieve some of that pressure, and without it, things would have been much harder—physically, emotionally, and financially.

The MFP has amazingly kind and caring individuals working there and it has made my life a lot better! It has made a tremendous impact on my health because I have a disability and they offer curbside pickup for the days I am struggling physically and financially.

The Maverick Food Pantry has let me stop worrying about trying to find the time and money for buying food and let me focus on school, my friends, and myself. It lifts a big weight off my shoulders.

Sometimes at the end of the month, the pantry at home can look pretty bare. The Maverick Food Pantry helps to fill this gap. This allows me to focus on my studies instead of worrying how I'm going to feed my family. Providing even just a few meals each month means I have more time to study, and more time with my kids and that is invaluable. I hope this service never goes away and only expands. Without it, I don't think I could have continued my education
