## Submit Animal Exposure Health Surveillance Questionnaire

- 1. Items needed for completion
  - a. <u>Outpatient Condition of Treatment and Demographics</u> forms
    - Electronic Health Information Exchange
    - Notice of Privacy Practices
    - Patient Rights and Responsibilities
  - b. Copy of vaccine history
    - Cat I: Tetanus every 10 years
    - Cat II: MMR series, TB test
- 2. Log in to  $\underline{RSS} \rightarrow EHS \rightarrow Med$  Questionnaire
  - a. Category I (required for all)
  - b. Category II (additional requirement for working with non-human primates)
- 3. Upload the COT and Demographics form
- 4. Upload vaccine history
- 5. Complete the questionnaire and submit
- 6. Check your email for notification from the UNO Health Center.
  - a. Emails will be delivered as a confidential message to your UNO email address. You must click and sign in to view messages.

## **Complete Occupational Health and Safety Training**

- 1. Email <u>iacuc@unomaha.edu</u> for access, including the following information:
  - a. Species you will be working with
  - b. PI/Faculty you are working with
  - c. If you are providing husbandry and/or will be doing research
- 2. Log in to Bridge and complete training with grade of 80% or above
