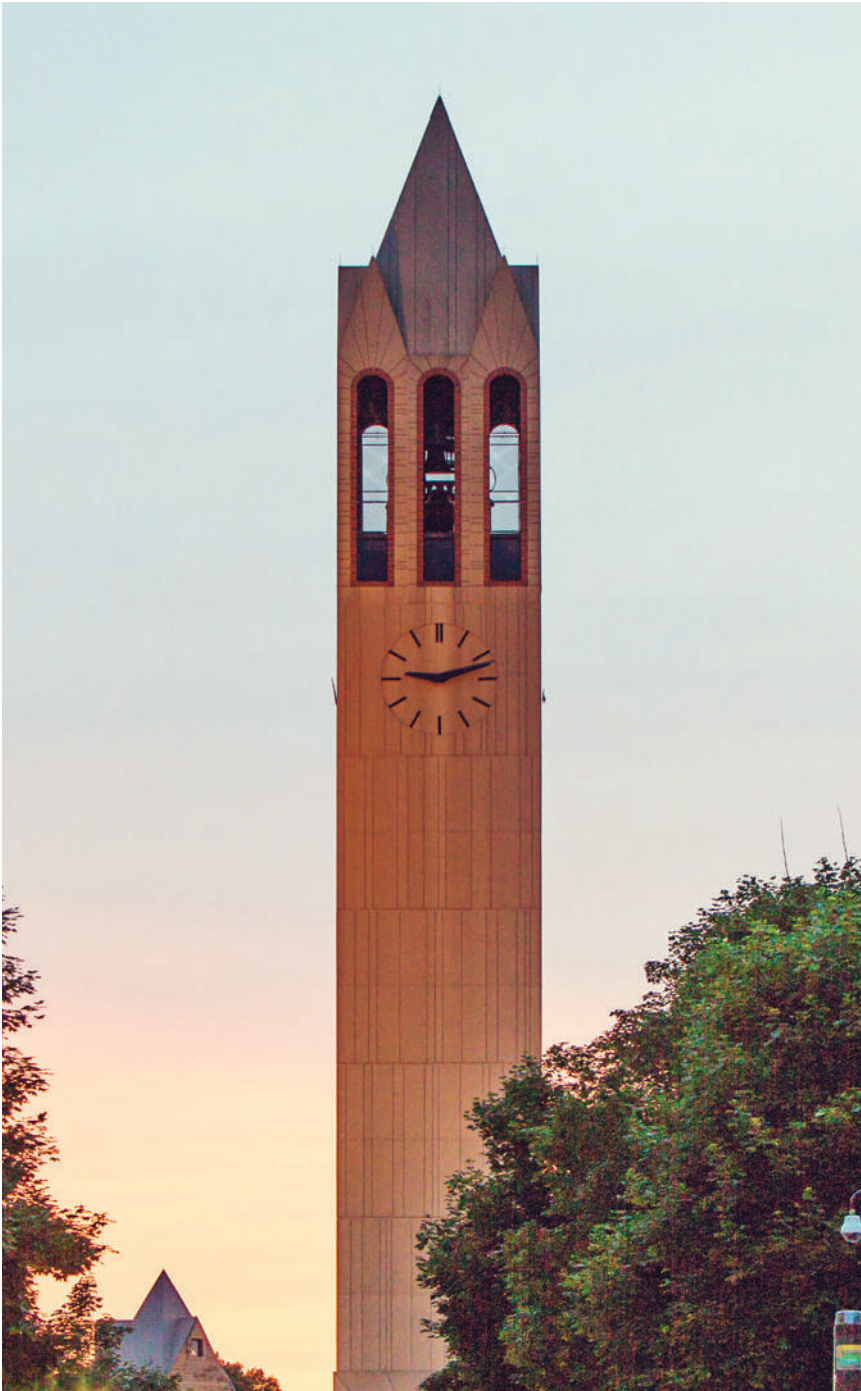

HELEN HANSEN OUTSTANDING GRADUATE STUDENT AWARDS

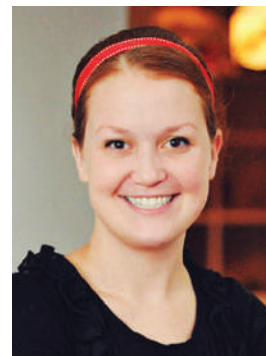
