- IV. Guest Speaker:
 - A. Victoria Kohout
 - 1. Nearing conclusion of the session!
 - a. Legislative Session calendar: https://nebraskalegislature.gov/#:~:text=Legislative%20Session%20Calendar
 - 2. Budget bill moved to round 2 of the debate, vote on Thursday 5.15.25, then to Gov. Pillen. Governor has the ability to line-item veto at that time.
 - 3. Nebraska Forecasting Board appt by Gov: set forecast for projected revenue for the state.
 - 4. \$4M increase in 1st year of biennium in costs. 2nd year of biennium: \$8M increase in costs.
 - 5. There may be a Special Session. (Why would this happen? Revenues are worse than what they forecasted, and the legislature is reconvening to discuss and make more adjustments.) UNO would be given a specific budget. If a Special Session occurs, there may be mid-year adjustments.

- a. Pg. 24 (of 299) is where University of Nebraska, as a state agency, is first listed in budget.
- B. Chase Kratochvil
 - 1. Just getting started on the budget process at the Federal level
 - a. House of Representatives and Senate will meet separately and come together to discuss cuts
 - 2. Projecting huge cuts to many federal programs (estimated 40-60%)
 - 3. Pace of 'Dear Colleague letters' has waned
 - a. Over 215 Exec Orders written; at least 100 of them in the courts. Most of the EO's will be held up in court, limiting what they can / can't do



- b. Referring to Office of the President Don't anticipate taking on any legal challenges, can't afford not to.
- c. NU System has already seen about \$70M loss in federal funding
- d. Dr. Gold will likely make strong recommendations to each Chancellor; but it will still be up to each Chancellor to make decisions related to their respective campuses.
- e. FNA rates are tied up in courts with temporary restraining orders. Expect to see a new bill capping FNA rates for all universities.
- f. \$40M in federal research awards. At this time, UNO doesn't know how much will be cut but we can likely expect between 25-75% cuts.
 - UNO doesn't rely on federal funding as much as UNMC and UNL.
 UNO relies more heavily on tuition revenue.
