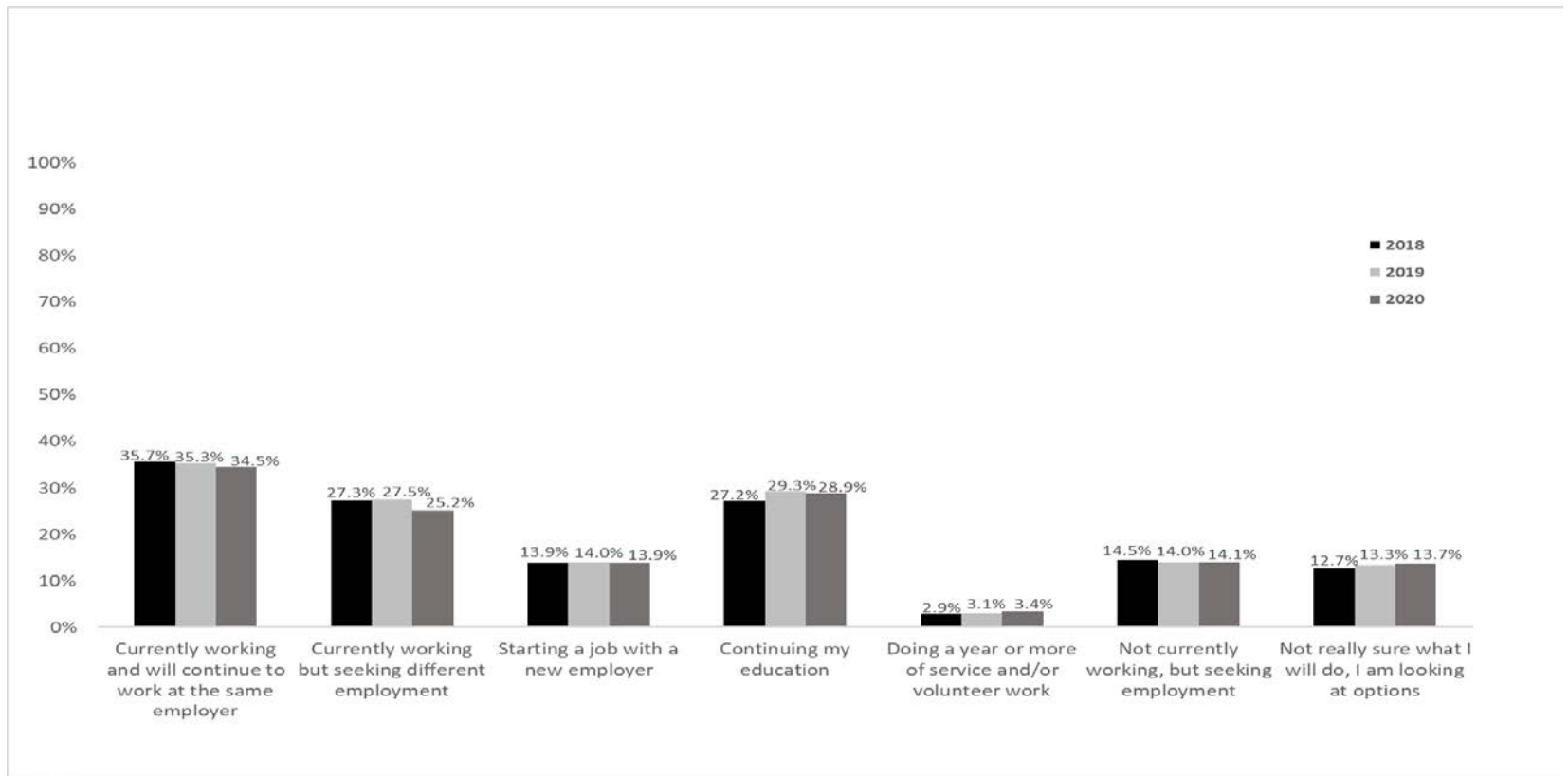

Which best describes your plans or situation after graduation? (select all that apply)

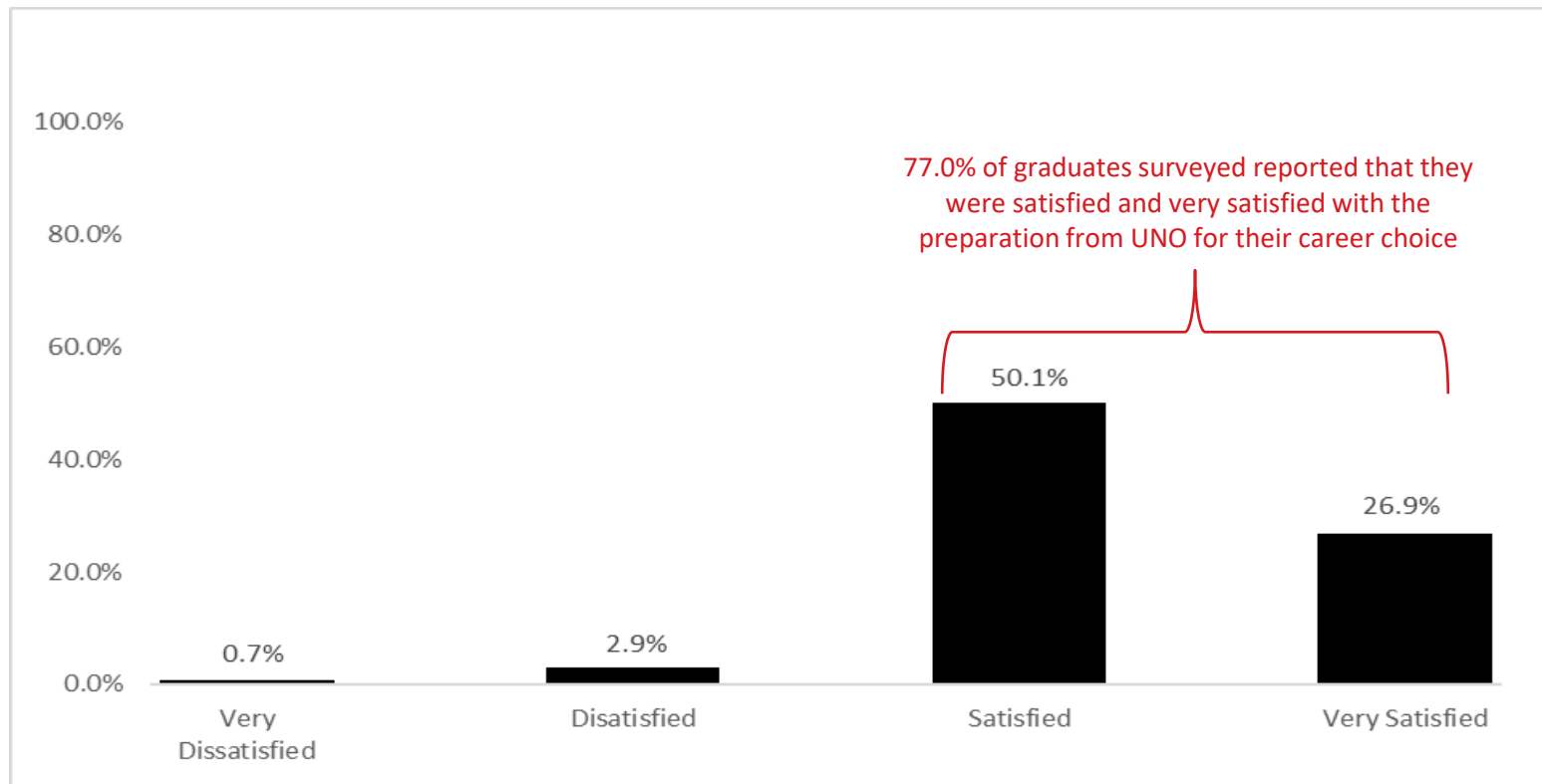

Based on your UNO experiences, how satisfied are you with your preparation for your work/career choices?



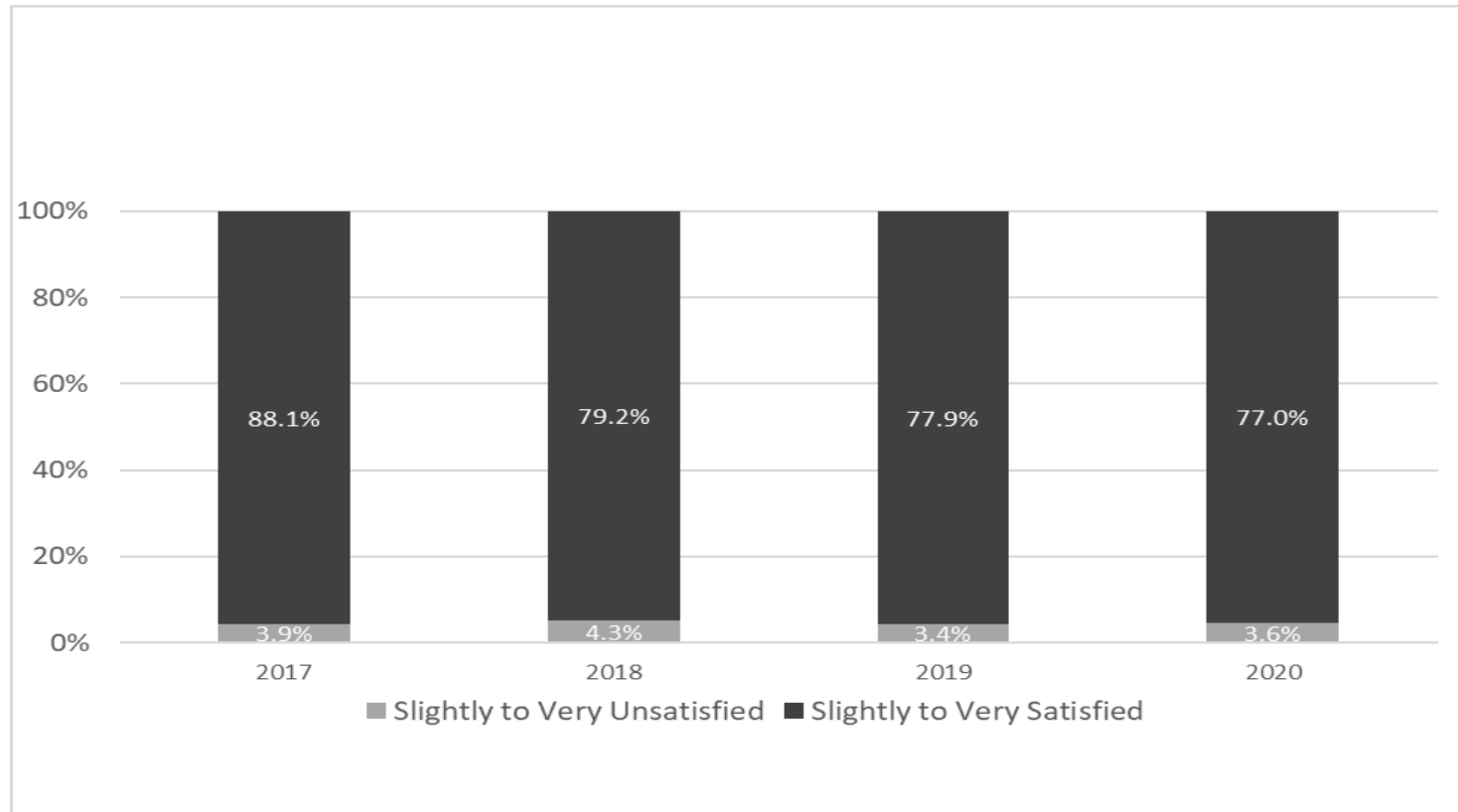

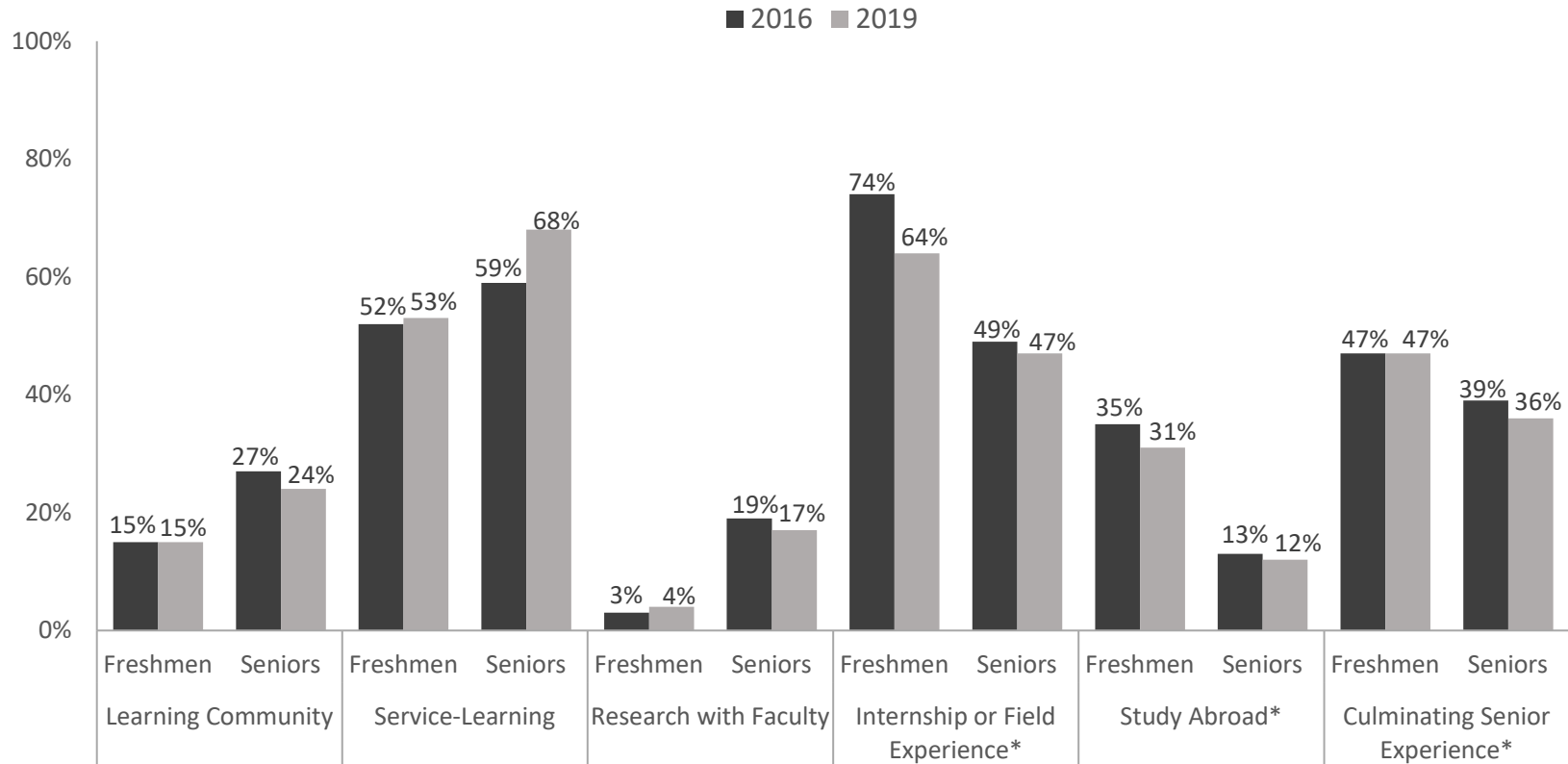

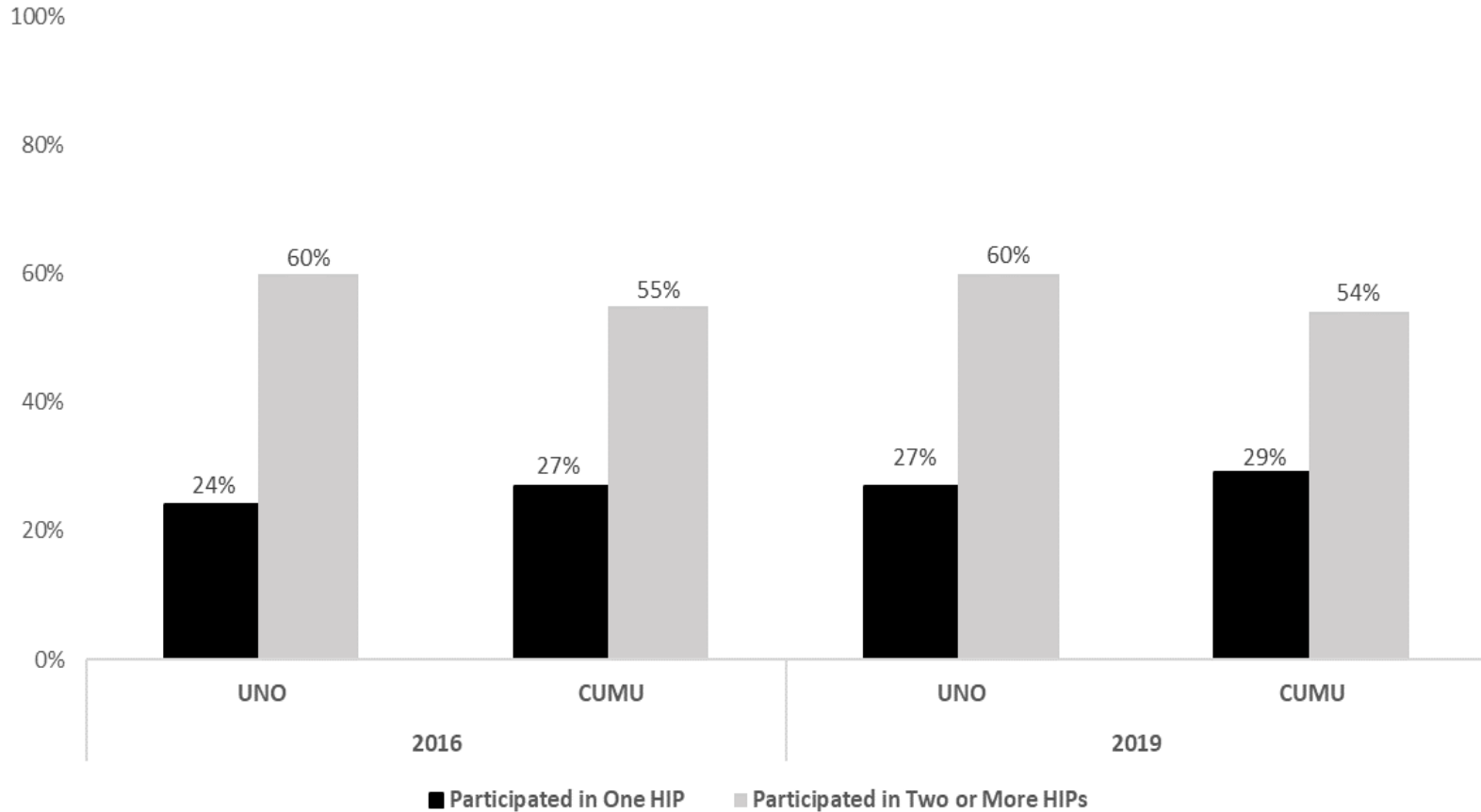

Participation of Seniors in High-Impact Practices (NSSE)



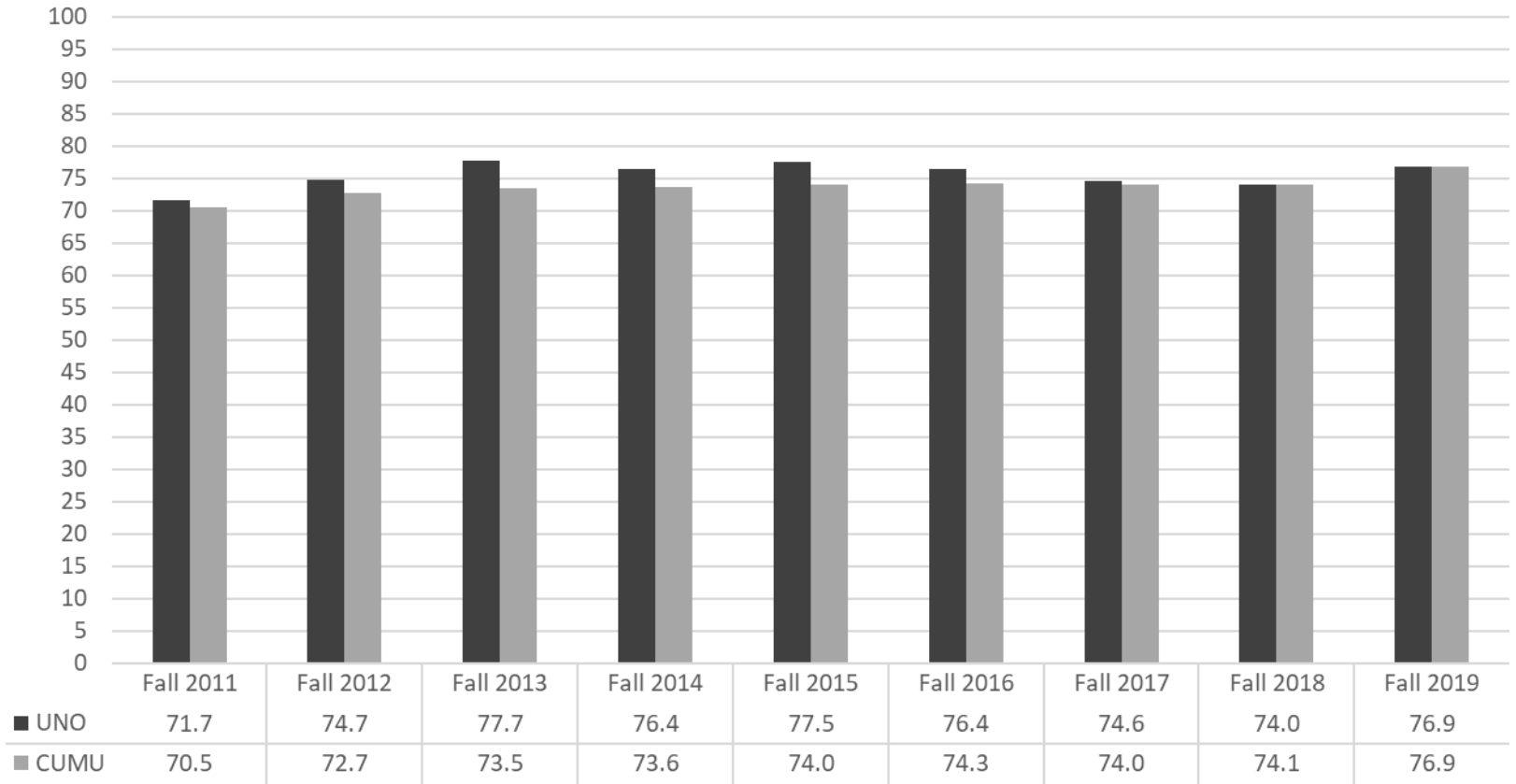

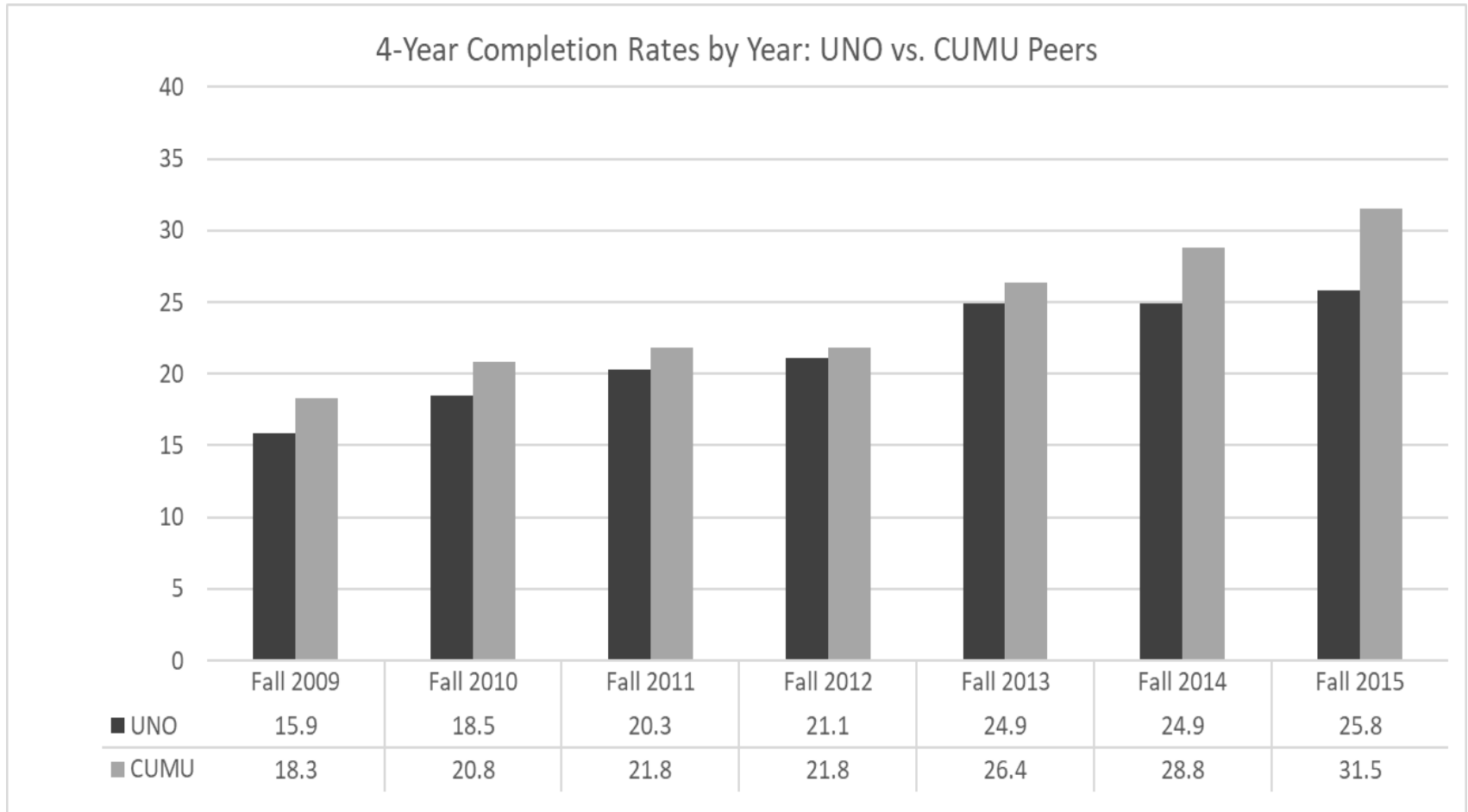
2-Year Retention Rates by Year: UNO vs. CUMU Peers

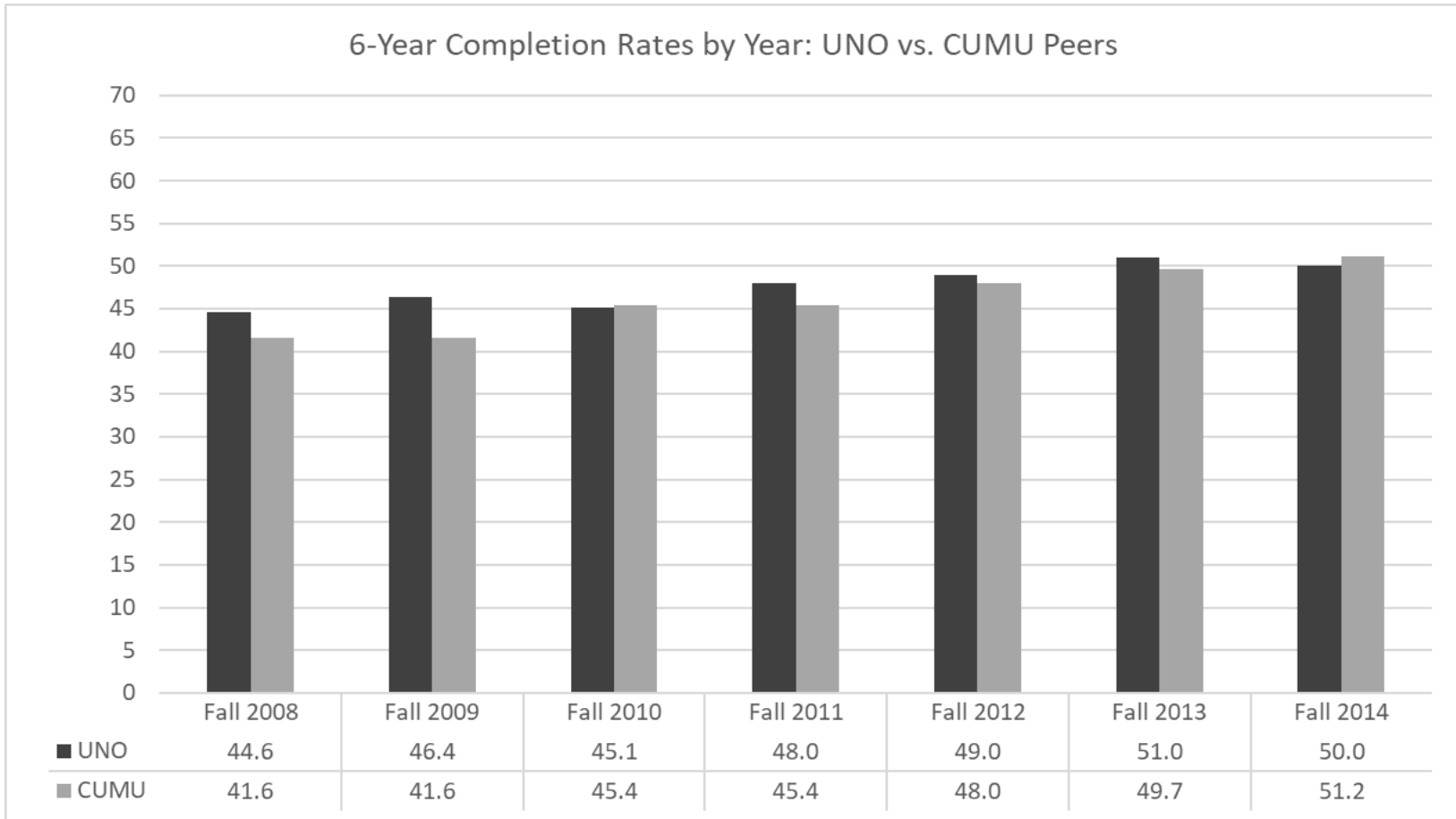

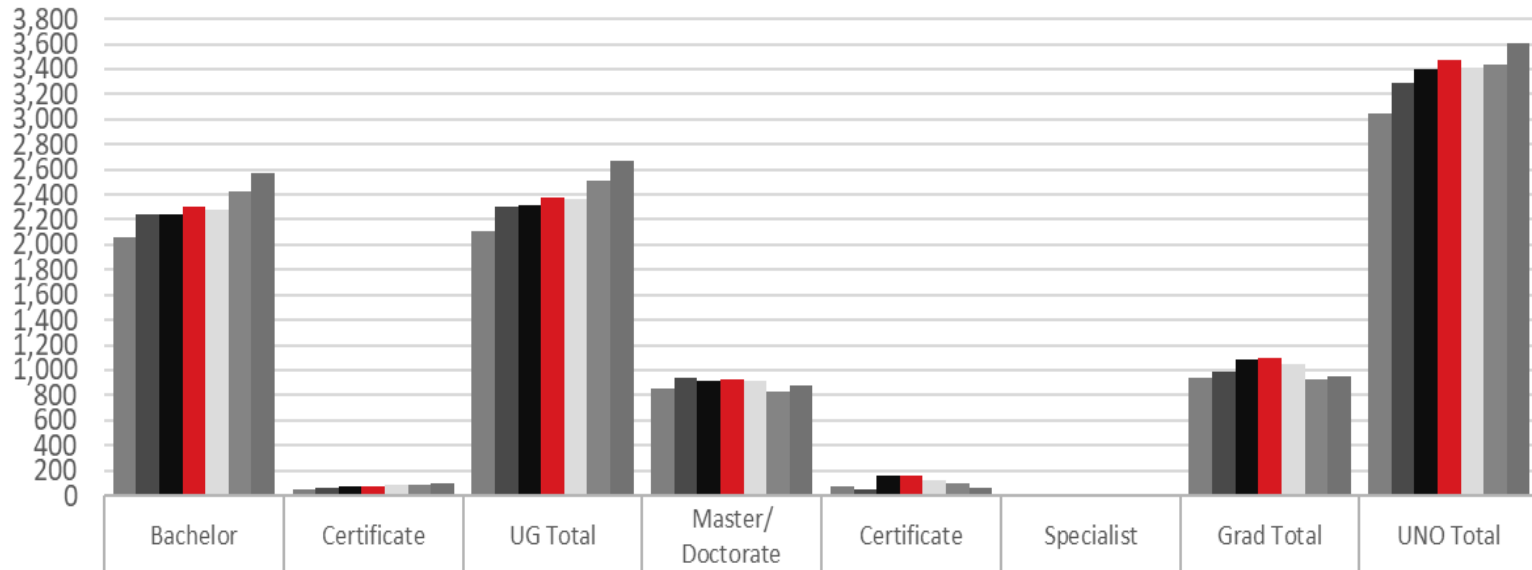

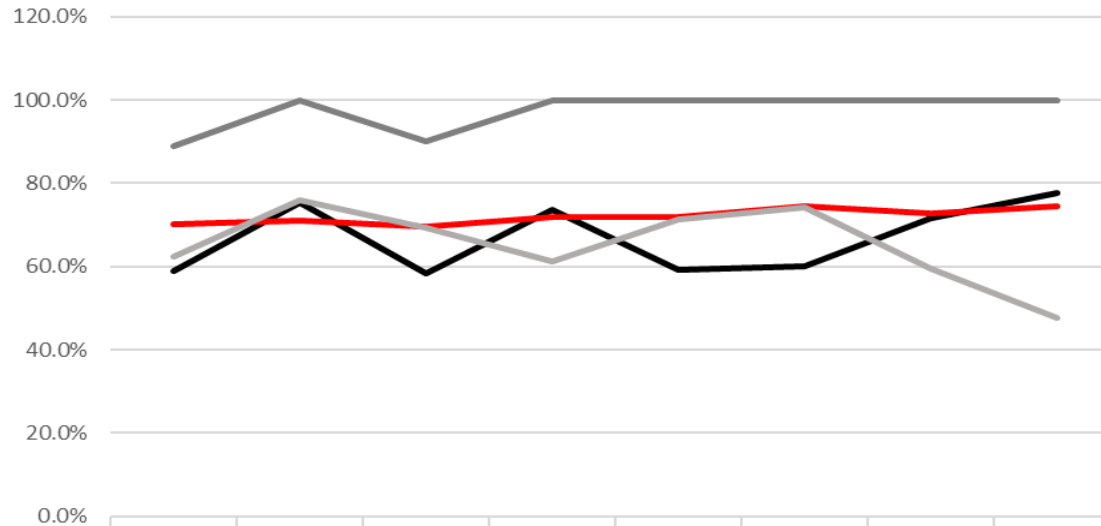

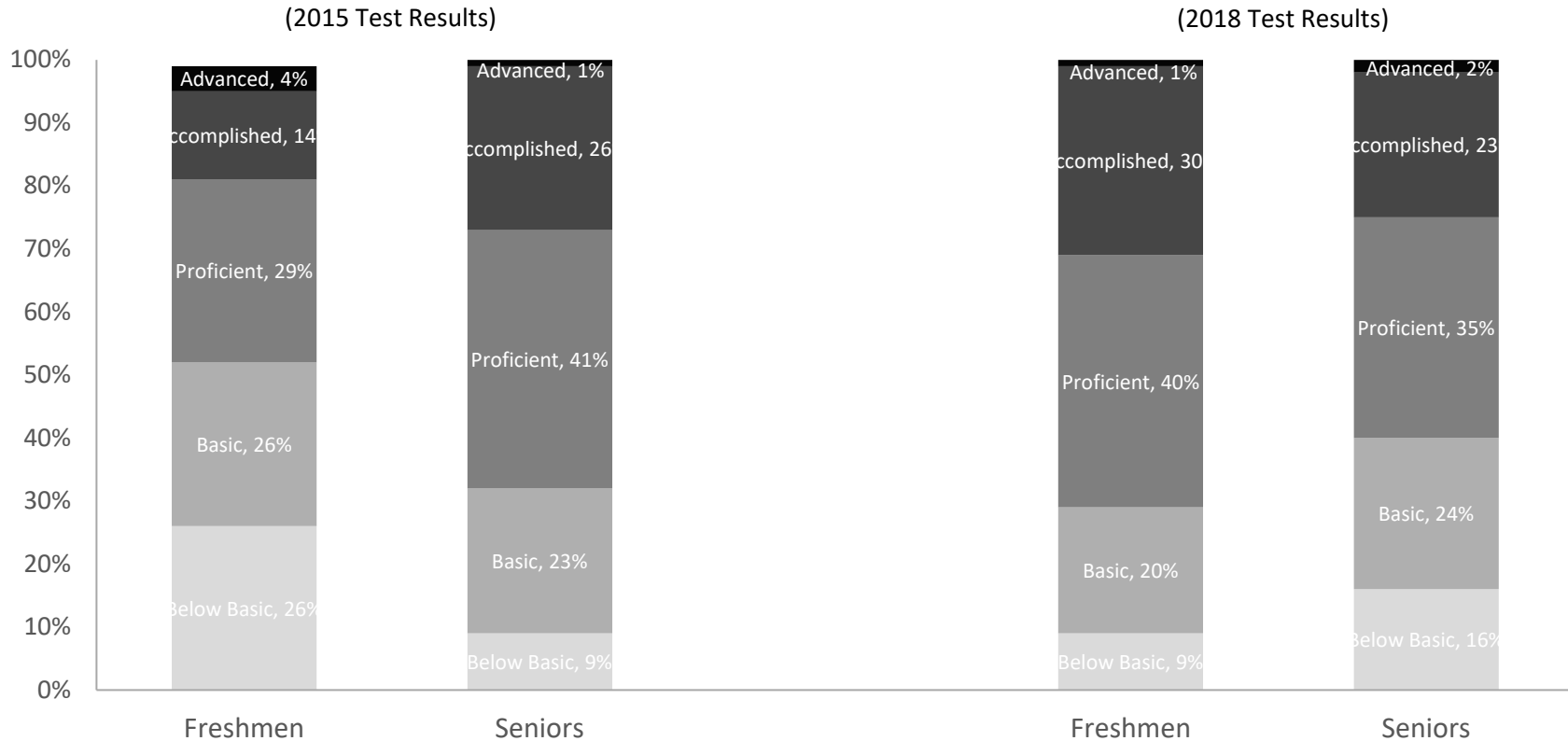
1. The entering year is defined by IPEDS year (summer, fall and spring terms) and represents the first term a student enrolled in a plan.
2. Students that complete a degree within 10 years are counted as successfully completing their programs.
3. These completion rates include only degree/certificate-seeking students. In the event one individual pursues more than one degree/certificate, it considers separately the completion/timeline for each degree/certificate pursued. This graduation rate should not be interpreted simply as an overall cohort rate, as is used for undergraduate student graduation rate.
4. 30% of the doctoral students entering since 2017 are still actively working towards their doctorate.

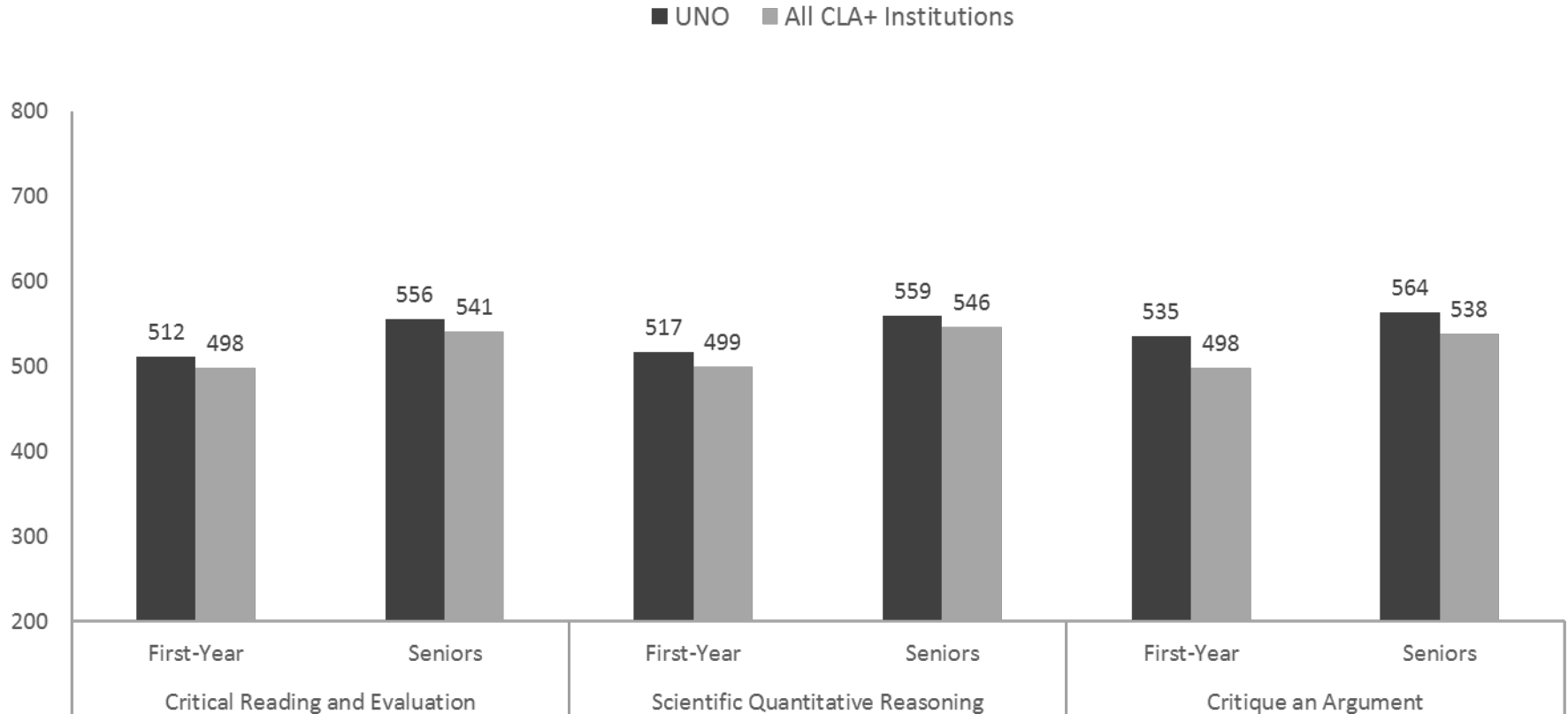

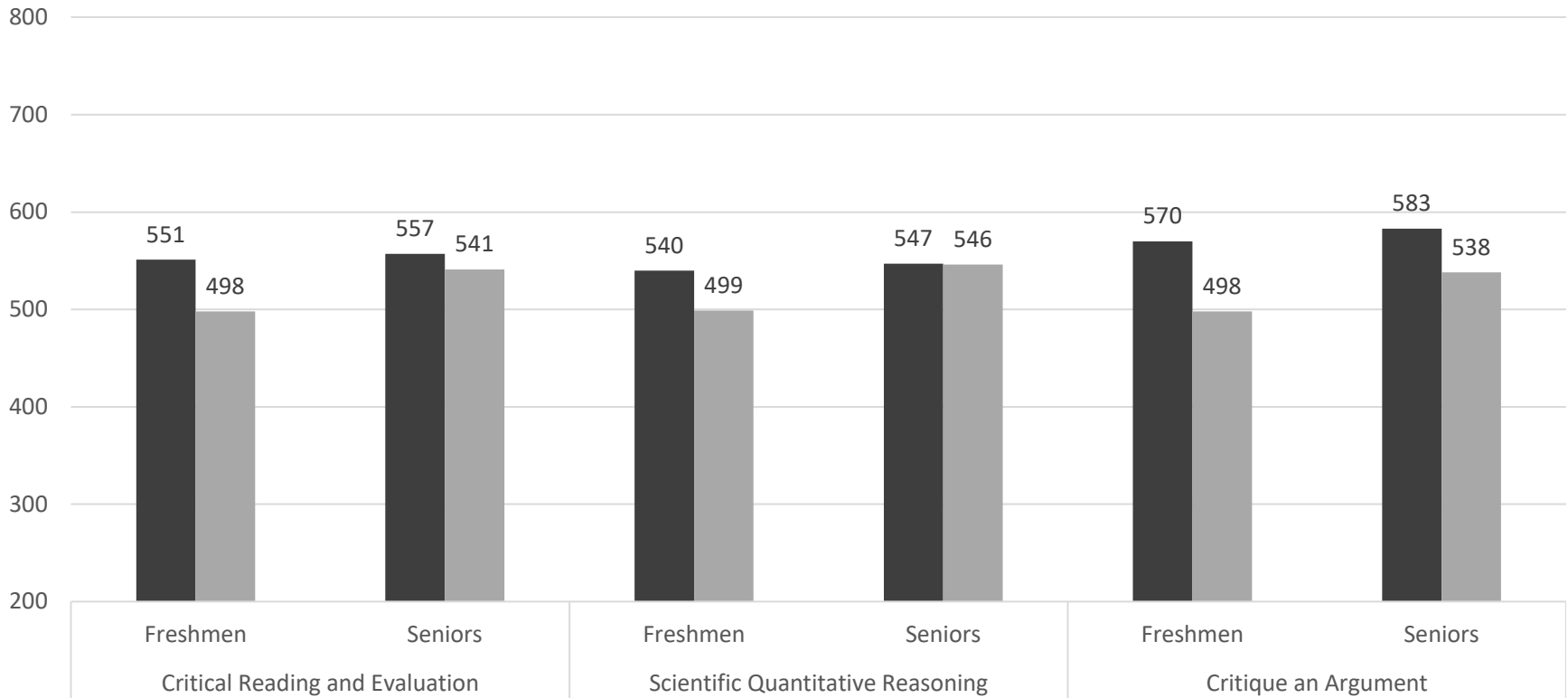
